Good morning! Hope all is well with you....staying healthy and warm also.

Before we get to today's short but very important clip, there has been lots of discussion about the screen clip from the weekend! GREAT! Keep talking with colleagues about that play AND otyher plays! We LEARN from each other!

Today's clip shows the vast difference in the angle that the play is seen from. The first angle is from high at midcourt and the second from the baseline. Take a look <u>here</u> and think about what you have from each angle.

Do you have the same call from both angles? Do you have an offensive hook from the midcourt angle and a block from the baseline angle? Regardless of what you have, angles are the basis of how we make calls. With that in mind, we must ALWAYS be looking to get the best angle to SEE a play, to SEE the competitive matchup. NO DOUBT the lead here *saw* white block the ball handler by bumping and extending the leg. I can certainly see why L called the foul on white. IF the call had come from the first camera angle, it MAY NOT have been the same. Remember, *move to improve* so that you get better looks at plays and matchups.
