Robert Moss to Keynote CAVORT 2014 Conference

Innovator and energetic educator, Bob Moss is one of the creative types who turns dreams into reality. Moss was instrumental in developing New York City's 42nd Street in the 1970s, from seedy to sparkling Theatre Row. Here are a few highlights from his experience:

Artistic Director

- Edward Albee's PLAYWRIGHTS UNIT, from 1970 to 1971, when it closed;
- Founded and ran Playwrights Horizons from 1971 to 1981, still an active board member; and,
- Simultaneously ran the Queens Theater in the Park from 1975 to 1981.

Teaching Experience

- Taught at, and subsequently ran, The Playwrights Horizons Theater School, affiliated with New York University, Tisch School of the Arts, Drama Department (Undergraduate) from 1983 to 1996:
- Taught at Hollins University's MFA program for four years; and,
- · Adjunct professor in the Syracuse University

Theatres

- Ran the Hangar Theatre in Ithaca, New York, from 1982 to 1996; and,
- Ran Syracuse Stage from 1996 to 2007.
