

# WEEKLY THOUGHTS SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST KING OF THE UNIVERSE NOVEMBER 21<sup>st</sup> 2021

Dear Friends, today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe and last Sunday in the Liturgical year. Thursday is Thanksgiving Day — an occasion to express our gratitude to God for all his blessing and favors showered upon us. Let us equally continue to be thankful to God for all the Spiritual growth and fruits received over the liturgical Year ending this week.

R1 taken from Daniel, speaks of the mysterious Son of Man with whom Jesus identified himself, coming on the crowds and giving dominion that will last for all ages.

In the Gospel Jesus assents before Pilate that He is a King. He clarifies that His kingdom does not belong to this world. Christ as King of the universe is far different from the earthly kings we know:


- He is humble. He rules as king by serving others. He opts to serve his subjects as servant of all as he washed the feet of his disciples.
- He never looked for honor nor desired to dominate others. He fled when they wanted to make Him a king after feeding the 5,000 people. He was a threat to earthly kings like Herod.
- His authority is rooted in truth not in physical force. He came to bear witness to the truth about God and His love for us all, about himself as the Son of God and about us as the children of God where we are brothers and sisters.
- His kingdom and reign of God is based on the Beatitudes to which we are all called to embrace.
- He rules by merciful love and humble service, by patient suffering and sacrificial death and by benevolent passion.
- The general law of his kingdom is the law of love. Our task is for you and myself to accept Jesus as my King and Savior by choosing to do his will.
- Jesus, give me the courage to surrender my life to you every moment of my life.
- Jesus, grant me the spirit of humble service to the Body of Christ as well as the ability to recognize your face in everyone the sick, poor and outcast.

Jesus, grant me the spirit to accept you as the King of love and living the law of love of God and neighbor.

This weekend Holy Infant marks in a Special way its 68<sup>th</sup> Dedication Anniversary. Let us be thankful to God for all the Blessing God has showered upon his people for the last 68 years. Let us pray that Holy Infant continues to be our Mother and Teacher in the Faith.
