- Provides support to the school in meeting their goals regarding the parental involvement provisions of Title I/ESSA.
- Assist Principal with annual Title I meeting, compact & compliance.
- Assist with monthly meetings, notices, guidelines, policies, bylaws, etc.
- Increase parent involvement in the school by working closely with all school, parents, and community organizations
- Provide training opportunities for parents around literacy and student achievement.
- Plan monthly in-service activities for parents
- Coordinate and facilitate activities with the Title I PAC chair, principal and parents.
- Develop and maintain a structured parent/community volunteer program.
- Conduct telephone, text and/or email contacts.
- Collect program data for continuous evaluation.
- Keep records and prepare reports:
 - Portfolio of progress
 - Monitor/Track Parent Progress
- Create a welcoming school environment for parents
- Serve as facilitator for parent and school community concerns
- Create periodic newsletters/calendars and coordinate communication with parents
- Performs other duties necessary to facilitate the achievement of the school goals

COST: Cost is based on the specific plan agreed upon between the participating school and PPES. Specific cost depends on the need, size of the school, and level of involvement. The average cost ranges from \$1500.00 to \$5,000 per school.
