- Assist with monthly meetings, notices, guidelines, polices, bylaws, etc.
- Increase parent involvement in the school by working closely with all school, parents, and community organizations
- Provide training opportunities for parents around literacy and student achievement.
- Plan monthly in-service activities for parents
- Coordinate and facilitate activities with the Title I PAC chair, principal and parents.
- O Develop and maintain a structured parent/community volunteer program.
- Conduct telephone, text and/or email contacts.
- Collect program data for continuous evaluation.
- Keep records and prepare reports:
 - Portfolio of progress
 - Monitor/Track Parent Progress
- Create a welcoming school environment for parents
- Serve as facilitator for parent and school community concerns
- O Create periodic newsletters/calendars and coordinate communication with parents
- Performs other duties necessary to facilitate the achievement of the school goals
