The purpose of Mississippi Severe Weather Awareness Week is to provide people with the knowledge necessary to protect their lives when weather threatens. Remember, Early Head Start and Head Start centers abide by the school district's decision to keep schools open or to close them due to inclement weather conditions.

If the local school district cancels school, the Early Head Start and Head Start center will also be closed. Constantly listen to the radio and watch TV for updated information. The bottom line:

Our best defense is to be both prepared and informed. Know the local warning systems; Invest in a NOAA Weather Radio; Stay informed: Take action — indoors or out!!

Social Learning

Some of the greatest sources of learning for young children are what they know best: their families and the people and places in their neighborhoods. Social learning begins the moment a mother and child gaze into each other's eyes at birth and continues through out the early childhood years as children from new relationships, learn to communicate and explore the world around them.

With almost every new experience, children form understandings that relate to geography, civics and history. To preschoolers, geography lessons come in the form of walking around town which will teach them about where the post office is located in relation to home.

Beginning civics education happens in the sandbox at the

playground where children learn to take turns and be mindful of others feelings. History is often as simple as the telling of the story of the day they were born or adopted, pointing out how much they have grown or what they can
