- 36:29 Set up a waltz rhythm by playing a root and fifth (1-5) bass note pattern in the left hand.
- 39:40 Alternate way to play a waltz rhythm with the bass note in the left hand. Play the first two beats only.
- 40:27 Create a simple arrangement
- 42:00 End of lesson
