It has now been one year since the pantry started using a tablet in place of the card system we used for years. At first volunteers were unsure how this new way of signing in clients would work, but now it is hard to imagine going back to the old way. As long as the tablet works correctly, which is probably 99% of the time, the intake process goes much quicker than the old card system.

The Eastern Illinois Food Bank, which is our governing agency, has added a question to the tablet to find out how many veterans we serve. The Food Bank is working with Feeding America to show the need for services to veterans. The population of veterans in need is probably larger than most people realize, and they certainly deserve any extra assistance they can receive.

The pantry here thanks all the military veterans we serve, along with the countless others we do not need to come through our doors. May God bless all of you!
