NEW POLICE CHIEF ON OCEANSIDE SAFETY

COASTAL BEACH RESILIENCE COMPETITION

Two years ago Oceanside funded a pilot project to design and build beach sand retaining structures on our beaches. The project was met by opposition from some residents and other SD coastal cities concerned about changing surf conditions and interrupting the southward flow of sand.

Jayme Timberlake (who spoke with us a few months ago) is leading a more comprehensive design through a resilience competition. From 34 initial proposals, 5 companies were selected by a combined expert and resident committee, with 3 finalists who will compete for the project.

The firms from the Netherlands, Australia and the US will have 6 months to develop plans, presenting their ideas in late December. An integral part of this competition is to get input from local citizens and interested parties. Workshop dates are Aug. 29, Oct 17 and Dec 13.

DID YOU KNOW....

Did you know.....that this is not the first time the Coast Highway has been redeveloped?

Originally there was no coast road at all. The north-south road was El Camino Real, a trail or later wagon road between the Missions. The San Luis Rey Mission and surrounding ranches were the most important part of Oceanside before 1888.

As the Ford Model-T replaced the horse and wagons, a coastal road was planned. In 1917 the State Highway Commission agreed to help pave from the north to Wisconsin Ave. In 1918, the street was named Highway 101.

Parking was always an issue on 101. In the 1920's, Merchants sought restrictions to limit parking to 1 hr and urged only angle parking to create more spaces.



There was a monument roundabout at 2nd and Hill, now Mission and Coast Highway, with a flashing red light to slow traffic. It was removed in 1930.

Today, large roundabouts are proposed at 76, Civic Center Dr, Michigan Ave and Wisconsin Ave. Mid-block blinking crosswalks are planned at Sportfisher Dr, Topeka St, Missouri Ave and Minnesota Ave.

Raised center medians, additional landscaping, improved lighting and other features also will be installed along the corridor. A new sign is being considered for over the road announcing to all "Welcome to Oceanside".
