Biography


St. Gregory VII (c.1015-1085) was born in Italy and originally named Ildebrando di Sovana which translates to Hildebrand of Sovana. He grew up in a devout Catholic family and his uncle, Laurentius, was abbot of a monastery in Rome.

As a young man, Hildebrand became close with Pope Leo IX. He was made a cardinal subdeacon and a legate. As a papal legate he served in France, Germany, and Italy. After Pope Leo IX's death, Hildebrand became a leading figure in the papal court of the next few popes.

Shortly after the death of Pope Alexander II, Hildebrand was quickly ordained a priest and raised to the papacy. He chose the name Pope Gregory VII in honor of the first Pope Gregory whose writings heavily influenced him. During his time as pope, Gregory VII worked hard to reform the Church he so loved.

At the time, the Church was facing corruption. People in leadership were selling sacred offices and sacramentals, some clergy were unlawfully marrying, and kings and nobles, were controlling the appointment of Church officials. Pope Gregory VII fiercely resisted these corruptions. In fact, in order to put an end to the Roman Emperor Henry IV's control over which bishops were appointed, he excommunicated him three times. Pope Gregory VII's desire was to reunite the Church under the banner of Christ and the Holy Eucharist, instead of under the banner of whoever was richest and desired the most control.

Pope Gregory VII is remembered as one of the most important popes in Church history and lends his name to the Gregorian Reform, the period of reform in the Church that secured freedom from the intrusion of civil rulers. Saint Pope Gregory VII, pray for us!

Ursuline Sisters of Mount Saint Joseph Announcement

150th Anniversary of the Ursuline Sisters: Display in Chapel and Music at Maple Mount Reunion

The Ursuline Sisters of Mount Saint Joseph are celebrating 150 years of service to God's people in 2024. The Sisters are "*Cultivating the Vine Saint Angela Entrusted to Us.*"

Father Paul Volk belongings on display: To celebrate the birthday of the priest who invited them to Daviess County 150 years ago --- Father Paul Joseph Volk – the Ursuline Sisters of Mount Saint Joseph are displaying his personal items throughout May in the gathering space of the Motherhouse Chapel, Maple Mount. Visitors can stop in to see them during May. Father Volk (May 16, 1841 – Nov. 2, 1919) was born in Germany. Ordained in 1865, he studied to become a missionary to the U.S. He was appointed pastor of St. Alphonsus Church in 1870, and in 1874 he brought the Ursuline Sisters to Daviess County to open Mount Saint Joseph Academy. He collected donations and acted as architect, contractor, and laborer in erecting the building. The place became known as Maple Mount because of the maple trees he planted. Traveling on foot and on horseback, he tended to the needs of the faithful, building many churches in Kentucky and elsewhere. In his late 40s, he answered the call to serve in South America, including Ecuador and Panama. He always wanted to help the poorest missions. 

St. Stephen of Hungary

Born a pagan in the 10th century Saint Stephen was baptized as a boy when his father converted to Christianity. Saint Stephen married Gisela, daughter of Duke Henry II of Bavaria who would become Saint Henry II. He succeeded his father as leader and began to transform the nation into a Christian kingdom.

Pope Sylvester II proclaimed him the first king of Hungary in 1001, sending him a crown and gold processional cross. The crown, made in the Byzantine style, has become a symbol of Hungarian nationhood.

King Stephen's reign was a relatively peaceful and prosperous time. He outlawed paganism, mandated church building, and tithing for support of the parish, and commanded all to marry except clergy and religious. He founded a Benedictine monastery, and Hungary became an important place along the route to the Holy Land for many pilgrims.

Unfortunately, Stephen's son and heir died in a hunting accident, causing much conflict over the succession when the saint died. Eventually the kingdom was won back for Christendom and father and son were canonized in 1083 by Pope St. Gregory VII. Saint Stephen I is now patron saint of Hungary. © LPi

Order Of Christian Initiation Of Adults


