| <p>Juvenile Justice Presentation (20 minutes)</p> | <p>Liz Lee DCYF Interim Probation Manager <i>Liz presented information regarding youth services and programs that are offered in Benton and Franklin counties for youth involved in the juvenile justice system. There are two systems, civil and offender. Civil systems include At-Risk Youth, Truancy and Guardian Ad Litem. At-Risk Youth petitions can be accessed through a parent referral through DCYF. The offender programs include diversion, community supervision and secure detention. There has been a law change and warrants cannot be issues and youth cannot be put into detention for truancy. All individuals who are removed from the home due to abuse/neglect will get a guardian ad litem or an attorney based on age and circumstances. Statistics in the tri-cities indicate that about 80% of first offenders that go through the diversion program do not return to the program. Those youth in community supervision have multiple programs available including FFT, MST, i-ACT and EET. EET is a new program that has been very successful and helps develop skills and</i></p> | | |

| | <p><i>obtain employment. If a youth is charged as an adult but is under 18, they remain in a JRA facility and can be up until the age of 25. Youth will sometimes go to a treatment facility such as Echo Glen or Greenhill School (which will be closing), or group home such as Twin Rivers in Richland. Youth in JRA have access to school and the center is also a GED testing site. They are also a CATS school which could be used for youth expelled from school who also have JRA involvement. Referrals have been increasing after they went down during Covid. They are hoping to get a new building sometime in the near future.</i></p> |
