the job in a timely manner. Please avoid placing you leaf piles near obstructions like sign posts, utility boxes, and fire hydrants. Do not place leaves in the street as this can clog the sewers. We ask that the leaves be placed on the tree lawn. As we have in past years, we will give daily progress updates on our web site (www. cityofwillowick.com) and on the City phone system (440-585-3700). Let's hope for a smooth leaf season.

Once again, there are two issues on the ballot for Willowick on November 2nd. Issue 3 is a renewal levy for Parks and Recreation. This is a current levy originally passed in 1986 and collects the same amount as it did 35 years ago. Based on the assessed value this collects \$7.78 per \$100,000 property value annually. Issue 4 is a proposed Charter Amendment. This is not a tax levy and will not cost the homeowner. This would if necessary to accommodate a business that may be interested in coming to Willowick. Currently we have referendum zoning which requires all changes to be placed on the ballot. Depending on timing of the next election, a potential business would have to wait in excess of a year to find out if it would be okay to open a business in Willowick. The new process would have the Planning Commission vote on it and then make a recommendation to Council. Once in front of Council, it would be on for three readings so the public would have a minimum of four opportunities to voice any concern. This would keep Willowick in line with neighboring city Charters and let Willowick be competitive in today's market. There are no current proposals that would require a zoning change. This Charter Amendment is an added tool to help Economic Development in Willowick.

Proposed Charter Amendment: Willowick City Proposed charter amendment: Amended to provide that the Council shall have the power to approve a change in the existing Municipal Zoning Map or change in the use of the property from the uses presently authorized by the existing zoning code. What this means is if a business wants to come into our city and use a building or build on a parcel that is zoned differently then what the company wants to use it for, Council would have a right to vote to change the zoning for that building or parcel after 3 readings during 3 separate Council meetings. Residents can voice their concerns or opinion during those three meetings. As of right now it takes up to a year or year and half to change the zoning for a building or parcel. Businesses do not have a year to wait; they end up going to other cities that have this type of zoning change in place. Voting yes would shorten the businesses wait time from a year to a few months giving Council the right to vote on the zoning change.

These are the Proposed Tax Levy's:

Willowick City RENEWAL: Funding for city parks & purposes recreational exceeding .5 mill, which amounts to .05 cents for each \$100.00 valuation. You have already been paying this in your taxes. There is NÓ IŇCREAŚE.

Lake County Community College RENEWAL 1.5 mill (.15 cents per \$100.00 valuation)

Issue 4 has been the main topic of my columns for the last three months. I have had discussions on Facebook as well as phone calls and emails from individual residents about issue 4. I believe voting YES on issue 4 will benefit the city by speeding up the process for businesses that want to come to Willowick but need to apply for a zoning change to make it happen.

A few people want to make this about their own personal mistrust of government officials. Every City Council member and the Mayor were voted into their positions by the residents of Willowick.We are open and transparent in everything we do as a governing body.

I have heard complaints about Council waiving the three readings when legislation is addressed at Council meetings. And yet those same people will admit that most Willowick residents do not attend the Council meetings to hear the legislation at one meeting let alone three. Perhaps that is because they trust the people they elected to represent them.

Another related issue was the increase in sewer rates that was approved by Council in October of 2020 at a Committee meeting and a Council meeting. Why were the three readings waived for that legislation? Were we trying to sneak it through? Maybe a better question is would it have mattered? I have never received a single email, phone call or question at a meeting about the increased sewer rates. If I had, I would have explained that the sewer rates NEVER increased in the past six years but the cost of maintaining the sewers has increased exponentially over those same six years due to the increased cost of EPA regulations to the treatment plant in Euclid.

These are the same people that complained about how bad of a job the City Council was doing continued at right

day is Tuesday, Election November 2nd and Willowick has two issues on the ballot.

Issue 3 is a Mill Renewal Levy for parks and recreation purposes. This is a renewal of the existing levy that was passed in 1986 and will not increase you property tax.

Issue 4 is a proposed Charter Change which would change the process to change zoning in the City. Currently any change in zoning must go on the ballot to be voted on and depending on the election cycle, could take well over a year. This issue would allow City Council to make any changes to zoning which would significantly speed up the process and allow businesses to move here quicker. The passage of this issue would ensure that Willowick would be competitive with other Cities in attracting new businesses. It is important to note that this change would not take away any residents voice on a zoning change that may come up as all zoning change requests would first go before the Planning Commission and then to City Council to be voted on after three readings. Both Planning Commission and City Council Meetings are public meetings which would give all residents a chance to address any possible zoning change.

Bankruptcy 101:

The two types of bankruptcy that most people hear about are chapter 7 and chapter 13. The word chapter refers to the chapter (like in a book) in the bankruptcy code. Chapter 7 is a liquidating bankruptcy and chapter 13 is a non-liquidating bankruptcy. Liquidating means they (the government) can take your stuff. Non-liquidating means they can't. However, there are exceptions to this. I will try to lay this out in a simplistic fashion:

In a chapter 7 you will be able to discharge all of your debts without paying anything back. However, if you have any equity in anything (your home, your car, your bank account, your boat- anything) you must surrender it to the bankruptcy trustee (the person who looks out for the creditors) so that it can be sold (liquidated) to pay back the creditors to the largest extent possible. Equity is what determines which chapter of bankruptcy you can file under. Fair Market Value minus Amount Owed equals Your Equity in anything.

A chapter 13 is a non-liquidating

bankruptcy. This means you get to keep everything, but you have to pay back a percentage of your equity. It is also used for people who are in foreclosure or behind on their mortgage and in fear of foreclosure. A chapter 13 requires a payback plan from between three to five years. The payment is monthly. The amount is determined, again, by the amount of equity you have accumulated in your life. This is referred to as your bankruptcy estate. Obviously, everyone wants to do a chapter 7 because it is no pay back. However, since 2005 it has become much harder to file chapter 7. In 2005, legislation was passed which tightened up the income restrictions on people with regard to the Chapter 7 bankruptcy. The intended result was that more

people must file under Chapter 13 of the Bankruptcy code and pay back, at least, what the government thinks they can afford.

It is the bankruptcy attorney's job to advise you which is the best chapter to file under. It is also the attorney's job to make sure you keep your home, your car, and everything else you have accumulated throughout your life.

As fall migration winds down, Blackbrook Audubon invites everyone to hear "Monitoring Bird Migration: Evolving Technologies and Remarkable Discoveries" by Dr. Andy Jones of the Cleveland Museum of Natural History. 



LCGHD is Offering Free Private Well Water Testing

The Lake County General Health District (LCGHD) is offering free private/residential well water samples on Tuesdays from October through the end of December. There are a limited amount of samples that will be available each Tuesday by calling (440) 350-2543. Appointments will be scheduled on a first-comefirst-served basis. A laboratory that is certified and approved for drinking water tests is used for processing the test. Water samples for home sale transactions are not eligible for this promotion.

LCGHD is encouraging homeowners to have their well water tested regularly. Private residential wells are often shallower than large volume public supply wells and more open to contamination. Unlike public supply wells, private wells are not regulated under the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water

"Many well owners do not regularly test their well water quality, and it's important that they have all the information they

need to make the best decisions to protect their well water and their health," commented **LCGHD** Chris Loxterman, Environmental Health Supervisor. LCGHD recommends that private well owners test their well water each year for contaminants, such as total coliform bacteria and other contaminants that may be of concern in your area. A homeowner may test more often if a problem is suspected.

Medicare Prescription Drug Plans (Part D) and Medicare Advantage plans change every year, and 2022 will bring some big changes! There are also savings in store for Insulindependent Diabetics as certain drug plans are participating in the Part D Senior Savings Model which is available to all people with Medicare. Plans that participate in this model will offer coverage choices that include multiple types of insulin at a maximum copayment of \$35 for a 30-day supply. People who enroll in a participating plan could save up to \$446 a year in out-of-pocket costs.

Understanding your Medicare options can be overwhelming but you don't have to do it alone - we are here to help! The Council on Aging has trained Ohio Senior Health Insurance Information Program (OSHIIP) volunteers available to help you make sense of the complicated Medicare system to make the best choices for your healthcare. counselors are ready to provide
