#### Bringing in the Harvest – Amana Farms Report Drought Worrisome

This past year with precipitation far below normal, the Amana Farms, Inc. team began the harvest anticipating that the yields would be down. While the results for some fields have exceeded expectations, others have been just as expected.

But so far, with the soybean harvest complete and the corn harvest over 60 percent done, the soybeans have averaged 48 bushels per acre and the corn has done about 205 bushels per acre. Yes, the soybeans are down this year as expected, but that's a pretty good corn yield given the lack of rainful, so overall it's not nearly as bad as some feared.

John McGrath, Amana Farms, Inc. noted that some years, when rains exceed the average, having sandy soils is helpful, but during a drought they are the first to dry out and they stay dry. "The sandy fields really hurt us this year," he reported.

Perhaps most worrisome of all for Amana Farms John McGrath is the state of the pastures. Over 1,800 cows are on pasture here. With so little rain, grass just hasn't grown, plus the small creeks and even local ponds are dry, or near dry.

"Many herds have needed water hauled in for much of the summer and a cow will drink 20 gallons on a hot day. Lots of work and quite expensive." McGrath added. Remember how hot July and August were? Hauling water to the cattle was a constant this late summer.

The need for rain continues. Autumn rainfall would help refill creeks, sustain the pastures and it would certainly help next year's crops and pasture conditions.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's 90 day forecast for lowa (released in late August) predicted we would see more rainfall in lowa this fall, but it appears to us that the rain has been falling to the north or south of lowa County. Only Benton County has received less rainfall this fall.

The lowa Dept. of Agriculture and Land Stewardship released September rainfalls for lowa that showed that September was almost 4 degrees warmer than previous Septembers and we in eastern lowa received only 2 inches of rainfall. That's 1.34 inches below normal and continues the drought trend in eastern lowa.

That report read: "Timely rainfall in northeast lowa in September helped to reduce the drought concern for that part of the state. While the large area of "Exceptional Drought (D4) was removed, a smaller area remains for parts of Tama and Benton Counties. Significant drought concerns remain for those counties and the surrounding area. Without normal to above normal rainfall this fall, eastern Iowa in general, and those counties in particular, could face a Drought Warning or even Drought Emergency, per the Iowa Drought Plan. The fall months are a time of reduced water demand, which helps to alleviate some concerns. However, normal to above-normal rainfall and snow are needed in the fall and winter months to reduce the impacts of drought in 2024. Current drought conditions have resulted in several county burn bans, and there are reports of voluntary and mandatory water restrictions in a limited number of communities in Iowa. As of the first week of October, the breakdown of drought categories was as follows: Abnormally Dry (D0) - 4%, Moderate Drought (D1) - 28%, Severe Drought (D2) – 40%, Extreme Drought (D3) – 24% and Exceptional Drought (D4) - 3%."

The CCA school board election is Tuesday, Nov. 7 polls are open 7 a.m. till 8 p.m. East Amana, Middle Amana, Amana and Homestead vote at the Middle Fire Station. West and South Amana vote in Conroy at the Hilton Hall.
