


Valentine's Day "He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." Micah 6:8



This month, stores are putting out Valentine's Day items. People are wondering what will I get my significant other. This year, Americans are expected to spend \$18.2 billion on Valentine's Day. The five most common items purchased on this day are a box of chocolates, diamond earrings, a dozen roses, dinner for two, and a bottle of champagne. Approximately 180 million cards will be exchanged today. And an estimated 14% of women will send flowers to themselves! All of this will be done in honor of St. Valentine.

The history of Valentine's Day – and the story of St. Valentine – is murky. The Catholic Church recognizes at least three different saints named Valentine, all of whom were martyred. One legend says that Valentine was a priest who served during the third century in Rome. When Emperor Claudius II decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and children, he outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death. Other stories suggest that Valentine might have been killed for attempting to help Christians escape harsh Roman prisons, where they were often beaten and punished. According to one legend, while Valentine was imprisoned he sent the first "valentine" greeting after he fell in love with a girl who visited him in jail. It is said that he wrote his love a letter before he died signed, "From Your Valentine," an expression still used today. We will probably never know the whole truth about St. Valentine. But one thing these various legends have in common is that Valentine loved others sacrificially. The stories differ, but the bottom line is the same: Valentine stood up for justice. He risked his life...eventually losing it... demonstrating his love for others, and for what was right.

Micah 6:8 tells us that there are three things the Lord desires from us: To act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with Him. Is this the type of love that is being celebrated today? Unfortunately, in many cases it is not. The world celebrates a love that is self-centered and dependent on feelings that come and go. Biblical love stands in stark contrast to that love. Godly love is patient, kind, honest, and sacrificial. It is rooted in God and not in self. It seeks to serve rather than to be served.

This Valentine's Day, think about how you love others. Is God honored in the way you love?

God, thank you for the love you have demonstrated through Your Son, Jesus. Help me to love others sacrificially and biblically, so that my life brings glory to Your Name. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Make jars of Italian barley soup to share love and warmth with friends



What you need:

- 1 cup pearled barley
- ½ cup sundried tomatoes
- 1 Tbsp dry minced garlic
- 1 Tbsp dry minced onion
- 1 veggie bouillon cube
- Glass pint jars with lids
- Cardstock
- Scissors
- Pen


What you do:

- 1. In order, layer the first five ingredients into the jar.
- 2. Trace the outline of the lid onto cardstock. Cut out.
- 3. On the card, write these directions: Remove wrapper from bouillon cube. Add contents of jar to saucepan. Add 4 cups water and a can of diced tomatoes. Bring to a boil over high heat, reduce to low. Simmer about 20 minutes, until barley is tender. Serve with parmesan cheese.
- 4. Place the card atop the lid. Screw on the canning ring to keep it in place.



Ash Wednesday Service will be on March 2, 2022 at 7pm at the church.

Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: we confront our own mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith. The form and content of the service focuses on the dual themes of sin and death in the light of God's redeeming love in Jesus Christ.

The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship. The Imposition of Ashes can be a powerful nonverbal and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. This practice is the historic focus of Ash Wednesday's observance and gave the day its name. It is traditional to save the palm branches from the previous Passion/Palm Sunday service and burn them ahead of time to produce the ashes for this service.

End of the Year Reports for Va. Conference

Each year all churches in the Virginia Conference are required to do year-end statistics. I thought you might be interested in some of the numbers that were reported this year.

According to our conference—Aldersgate currently has 199 people on our roles...yet only an average of 36 attend services. (We do a membership audit each year—maybe we can lower this number to be more actual).

In 2021 we had an average of 160 people each week visit our youtube and web pages. Actual hits was 8,685.

We serviced an average of 7 missions and ministries through out this past year. An average of 135 persons served in these ministries and 3,106 persons were served. These were: Cooke Elementary, Union Mission, Salvation Army, Newborns in Need; Wesley Ministry in Portsmouth; Partners in Education, Blankets for Homeless and UMCOR.

The Aldersgate family can be a little proud of these reported stats. As we strive to do more this year with our missions and ministries remember all of the comfort you are giving to our brothers and sisters in the community.


