I hope that you have had the chance to enjoy some of the sights, sounds, and activities that make summer in Minnesota so special!

With the inevitable return to school creeping up on children and parents alike, changes to the summer routine are upon us at church too. Julie E. opened the meeting and Pastor Germain led in devotion and prayer.

Motion to approve the minutes of the June meeting was m/s/c.

Treasurer's Report: David presented his report as of 8-1-18. No major concerns at this time. We have received part of the insurance payment for organ repair as well as a number of donations. Giving is on track. Motion was m/s/c to receive the report.

Pastor's Report: Rev. Germain shared his activities for July and August. The usual pastoral duties including 3 funerals, some vacation time and Guard duties. He and Julie have a spread sheet which enables them to track vacation and Guard time, etc.

Christian Ed: The Board will serve the Community Meal on Aug. 29. They are in search of a new curriculum as well as persons willing to teach Sunday School (2 classes – Preschool thru 2nd grade and 3rd thru 7th). There will be no first year confirmation class as there is only one student and he is willing to wait until next year to start. SS classes will begin Sept. 30th. 365 Children Stories will be presented to 3rd graders and confirmation students will receive Bibles.

Facilities: Dean reported on various repairs made, landscaping plans being made for the Erma Rosen memorial, remaining insurance money for organ repair will be coming soon.

Mission: Sept. Blessing Box will be the Starfish Fund. November and December community meals have no one committed to prepare and serve. The Board has some ideas they will pursue.

OLD BUSINESS

There was discussion regarding church use by outside groups scheduled for the upcoming season. Julie and Pastor Cory will follow up. Organ repairs are expected to begin soon. Julie is looking into fabric to replace burlap in organ chambers.

There was discussion regarding the upkeep of the nursery. CE will follow up before the Anniversary celebration.

Pastor Cory closed the meeting with prayer and the meeting was adjourned.

September Blessing Box - Starfish Fund

The September Blessing Box offering will go to the First Congregational UCC Starfish Fund. The Starfish Fund is a benevolent fund established during Reverend EvaLyn Carlson's interim service with us. Rev. Carlson, along with a church member who wished to honor her children, started First Congregational's Starfish Fund. This fund was designed to serve members and others who had financial needs that could not be met through their own means, nor were family or public programs available to help. Gifts from Starfish have been used for co-pays for medication, for support with mental health needs, unusual utility fees or unexpected car expenses, for housing and food for families during long hospitalizations of a family member and for many gas vouchers for strangers and others.

Gifts given to the Starfish Fund are used primarily for members of our church. Occasional gifts are combined with support from other churches through a coordinated ministry so as to serve those whom a single fund could not serve, particularly for those who are not part of a church family but need short term assistance after all other avenues have been exhausted.



The Starfish Story

A young man is walking along the ocean and sees a beach on which thousands and thousands of starfish have washed ashore. Further along he sees an old man, walking slowly and stooping often, picking up one starfish after another and tossing each one gently into the ocean.

"Why are you throwing starfish into the ocean?" he asks.

"Because the sun is up and the tide is going out and if I don't throw them further in they will die."

"But, old man, don't you realize there are miles and miles of beach and starfish all along it! You can't possibly save them all, you can't even save one-tenth of them. In fact, even if you work all day, your efforts won't make any difference at all."

The old man listened calmly and then bent down to pick up another starfish and threw it into the sea. "It made a difference to that one."

Who's my neighbor and whom should I love . . . it's anyone who has a need.

As you go through the month of September, prayerfully consider your ability to donate to the Starfish Fund. The fund is available for those who are down on their luck and need help getting through a tough time. **If you need help or know of someone needing help, please contact the Church Office at ucc319@frontiernet.net or 235-5382 or Pastor Cory at firstcongregational@gmail.com or 507-848-7305.** Use of the fund is confidential. If you are able to help with a donation, you can leave it in the church office or put it in the offering plate with a designation of STARFISH on the donation, or you can put it in the Blessing Box Offering on September 23, during our anniversary celebration. Many people like to give to the Starfish Fund in honor or memory of a loved one. There are cards with Starfish magnets available by the Raffle display you may give to those you are honoring to remind them of the gracious gift you gave in their name.

Your donation may not seem like it can do much, but if we work together, we CAN make a difference to our neighbor who needs it.

Remember to not only count your blessings, but to share them.



Through your generosity, our congregation's Starfish Fund continues to provide help to those in need in our community.

- Recently I had the opportunity to help a single mother and her 13-year-old son find a hotel room until her first paycheck came in. They had been staying with her sister and brother-in-law, but chemical dependency issues caused the sister to skip town, and the brother-in-law put them out unexpectedly.

- Earlier this summer, I was able to team up with St. John's UCC and Grace Lutheran to purchase a bus ticket for a young man who had gotten stranded in Fairmont on his way from Sioux Falls to New Jersey.

In cooperation with Poppe's 66, I have also been able to offer \$20 vouchers to several people needing gas to get to medical appointments or even job interviews. No money goes directly to the recipients, but Poppe's bills us at the end of each month for any vouchers we issue.

The family of Laura Jaqua was familiar with our Starfish Fund, and knew that it was exactly the kind of community outreach Laura was passionate about. They specified in her obituary that in lieu of flowers, funeral materials be directed to our Starfish Outreach Fund or the American Red Cross.

Through the blessing of similar memorials, and your continued generosity whenever you might donate, our little Starfish will continue to regrow and assist those around it. Thank you for entrusting me to administer this resource on behalf of First Congregational UCC!

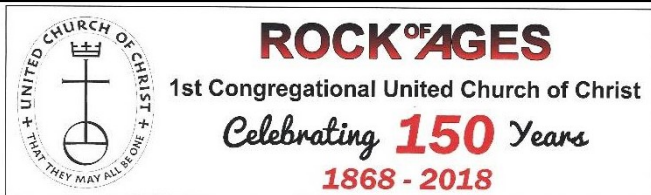

TOM JORGENSEN INTERVIEW

Tom Jorgensen shares a fascinating history of family, farming, and commitment to First Congregational Church. His grandparents, John and Seena Jorgensen, were active members in the early 1900's. Seena's scrapbook tells of Ladies Aid suppers held at their farm, of Clara Lovell's reporting in the "Home Library Digest" about "Husband of Elizabeth Luedtke" (Dr. G. H. Luedtke). Her scrapbook chronicles the early life of the church, and names many prominent individuals as active participants in church activities. One such story details the opening of the Amber Lake School, taught by Miss Leone Keithan, who later became Leone Celander. Harry Jorgensen, son of John and Seena, was an active member of First Congregational and the farming community. With Helen (Sill) six children (Donna, Bryce, Kenneth Betty, Harry Jr. and Tom) were Sunday School and Confirmands. Betty Wise and Tom are the surviving children, along with Kenneth's wife, Wanda (Rowan). Tom remembers being confirmed by the Reverend Everett Manes, along with his class members Pat Graham Steuber, Nancy Benschoter Moye, Mary Kay Fitz, Joyce Mackey, and Bob Meschke.

Asked what has kept Tom involved with the church he replied, "I just always was. It's part of our heritage, and what we do." He and his wife, Kathy,

have been active with boards and Christian Education programs as they raised their children Kirk and Tamara. The family connection continues as Kirk and Gina's children, Trent and Gretchen, serve as acolytes and active children's story participants. Tom's pride in being part of a fifth generation church family is evident as he shares stories of his grandparents, parents, children and grands. Tom was very close to his grandparents John and Seena, and he found that understanding his grandmother's death when he was about 11 years old was difficult. Over the years, church membership has helped him cope with that loss. Two of the hymns that have been helpful over the years have been "Amazing Grace" and "How Great Thou Art".

As all of the other interviewed individuals have remarked, Tom feels that our greatest challenge will be to attract younger families, and to encourage children to attend Sunday School regularly. Weathering the storms we've faced as a congregation and the ability to stick together are some of the reasons Tom believes we remain strong.

Another fifth generation family in our congregation brings a sense of continuity. The old hymn "Forward Through the Ages...in unbroken line" speaks to the loyalty and faith of the Jorgensens.

Jorgensen Recipes

The Jorgensen farm has produced great food for the table. Helen Jorgensen served these with pride.

PLUM CATSUP

5# (about 50) medium purple plums

2 c. cider vinegar

4 c. sugar

3 t. ground cinnamon

1 t. each ground allspice, cloves

1/8 t. cayenne pepper (red)



Place plums and vinegar in large kettle. Boil 12 minutes until skin breaks and fruit is soft. Press fruit and liquid through colander or coarse sieve. (About 8 ½ c. pulp.) Combine with remaining ingredients. Cook on medium heat until thickened (about 30 minutes) or until two thick heavy drips run together off a clean metal spoon. Remove from heat. Skim. Pour into sterilized jam jars. Makes about 4 pints. Great with pork loin and pork chops.



RHUBARB WINE

Cut rhubarb into fine pieces. Put into a crock and fill with boiling water. (1 qt. for every pound of rhubarb). Let stand for three days.

Remove rhubarb, add 1 pound of sugar for every quart of juice. Add 1 lemon cut up and 1 c. raisins for each gallon of juice. Let stand nine days.

Drain well and let stand two months. Bottle. It is ready!

RICE PUDDING

½ c. cooked rice 2 ½ c. milk ½ c. sugar 2 T. cornstarch salt 2 eggs, beaten

1 t. vanilla

Cook milk, sugar, cornstarch, salt and egg yolks until thick. Stir in rice and vanilla.

Beat egg whites and 4 T sugar to make a meringue. Spread over pudding in ovenproof pan. Brown in 400 degree oven.

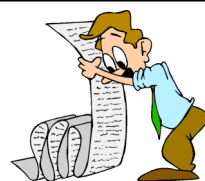


HYVEE & FAREWAY RECEIPTS

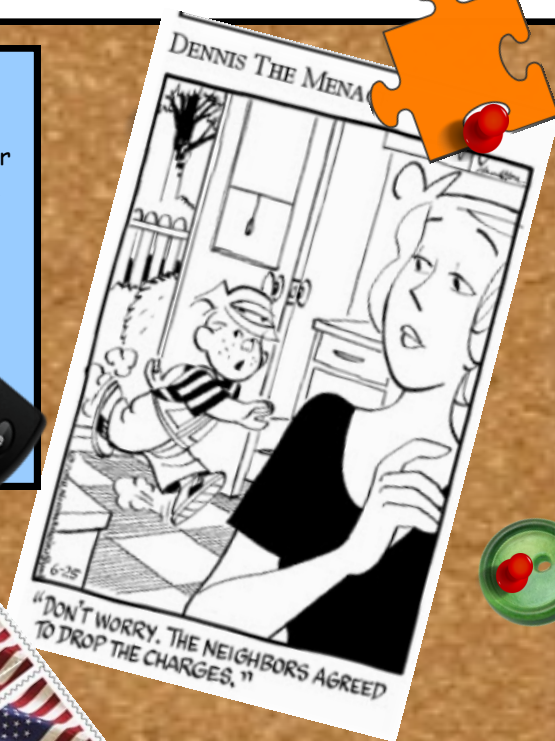
During the last five weeks, \$24,404.11 (16.27%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were turned in. We are now at \$27,686.51 (18.46%) toward the \$150,000 goal.

During the same five weeks, \$4,794.39 (3.20%) worth of Fareway slips were received. Fareway is now at 95.56% of the goal, or \$143,345.66 of the \$150,000 goal. Because another group has given up collecting slips, we have \$5,000 to add to ours, therefore we could reach the goal before next months report. We used their \$18,000 from Hy-Vee in December 2016.

Keep those slips coming. Even older slips can still be used as well as those where the gas was only \$0.18, yes, free gas except for the point 9 cents per gallon. - Jim Bock
