## **CHAIRMAN'S CORNER - Nancy Ordowski**

HELP IS NEEDED ON NOVEMBER 6.

Having observed many problems/challenges on August 28 at several of our precinct polling locations, I am even more aware of the help we need from each of you.

POLL WORKERS – They were short more than 300 workers. I know it is a long day of work, but many of us are capable of working that one day. Several polling locations had only Democrats working, that should never happen, the teams should have equal representation. A training will be held.

POLL WATCHERS – We were only able to man 15 of our 57 precincts. On November 6 we need observers present at more locations. You can usually observe at 2 to 3 locations and it is your responsibility to contact me or the lawyers to report problems. A training will be held.

ELECTIONEERS – To be 75 feet outside the polling location to hand out slate information for Republican candidates in that precinct. We can work rotations if enough of you volunteer. Palm cards will be made available.

CALLING VOTERS – Call voters on Monday and Tuesday (those who have not returned their ballots) reminding them to vote on Tuesday.

One other job that we need to work – those of us **who can walk our precincts**need to be talking to our Republican voters and sharing the Golden Tickets with them. These Golden Ticket have been printed and paid for by MCR. This work needs to start by September 15 or as soon as we have the Golden Tickets available and continue until November 6. There is a job for each of us and we will need all hands on deck to help our Republican candidates win.

- Prayer & Pledge of Allegiance Tim Horn, LD23 1st Vice-Chairman
- Introduction of LD23 officers Nancy
- Introductions of elected officials in attendance Nancy: (State Rep. Michele Ugenti-Rita, MCR Treasurer Sheila Muehling, MCR Member-at-large Janell Buchholdt, AZGOP Treasurer Bob Lettieri, FHUSD Governing Board Member Judy Rutkowski)

- Introductions of new PCs, candidates, and guests Nancy
- Preview of next month's meeting: A discussion of the November ballot initiatives at FHUSD Learning Center - Rich Rutkowski, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Chair
- Speakers:
  - Maricopa County Supervisor Steve Chucri
    - Maricopa County is 4th fastest growing county in US, with >200 new people each day
    - Property tax rate remains flat
    - Saving money by renovating existing buildings rather than building new ones
    - Renegotiation of Chase Field agreement to benefit county
    - Q&A included election related topics, addressing voting delays in the 2016 Presidential Preference Election, some actions of the current Democrat County Recorder Adrian Fontes, and consideration by the Board of Supervisors to assume jurisdiction over elections, removing it from oversight by the County Recorder.
  - o Ken Bennett, candidate for AZ Governor
    - Explained his concerns about several of Governor Ducey's promises and subsequent actions in office
    - Governor Ducey's reaction to the "RedforEd" movement prompted his (late) entry into the race
    - Asked for clean elections donations
    - Supports President Trump, border wall, legal immigration
    - Proposes a priority-based budget, favors streamlining state government, and pledges to run the state as efficiently as he ran the SOS office
  - Candidates for AZ State Senate
    - Tim Jeffries: would be 1st Director of a state agency to serve in AZ Senate; would reduce number of state employees by 10%
    - Kristina Kelly; only REP teacher seeking a legislative seat; opposes "Invest in Ed" initiative in favor of better ways to get dollars to classroom
    - Michelle Ugenti-Rita: "proven conservative;" record indicates her support of limited government, lower taxes, opposition to higher sales tax and the National Popular Vote
- City of Scottsdale report Barry Graham: the "EDGE" opposition will be on the November ballot; major rezonings are occurring
- Treasurer's report Valerie Giramberk: Balance is \$9,477.48. Dan Ishac of the Audit Committee reported that its review was complete, all was in order, and complimented Valerie on her good work.
