(food for thought) (Bulletin 29 May, 2022) Gospel: Jn 17: 20-26. "Taking Sides"

Jesus has been preparing his disciples for his departure. But as we prepare to celebrate the Ascension and anticipating the gift of the Spirit on Pentecost, Jesus' words take on an additional meaning today for us, the faith descendants of those disciples around the table with him. He prays first for his disciples; later he will pray for us who have come to believe through the preaching of those disciples. These men and women represented all those who would believe in the future. They formed the first Christian community, and it is in them that Jesus places his trust. His hunger is for faith. His thirst is for Truth. He consecrates himself for his friends, so that they may be consecrated in that Truth and bolstered by the strength of that Faith.

There is clarity in Jesus' final prayer for his disciples. He prays for four things - unity, joy, holiness, and mission; "Father - keep them safe, keep them united ('that they may be one'), keep them joyful ('that they may have my joy'), keep them consecrated ('sanctify them in the truth'), keep them mobilized for the mission ('so I have sent them into the world')."

When all is said and done, a community of faith is not judged by its doctrines and beliefs, but by the kind of people it produces and the truth it speaks.
