

February 23, 2020 Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Mt 5:38-48

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

For the love of enemies! That is a tough one! Jesus teaches us how to overcome our enemies. Love them! Like the church sign I saw once, it read, "Get rid of your enemies; make them friends!" Jesus asks his disciples to be the bigger person whenever they are insulted by an injustice or taunted by a bully. I am reminded of the fourth and fifth spiritual works of mercy which are 'to bear wrongs patiently' and 'to forgive offenses willingly' (the rest of them are in catechism #2447). Specifically today, Jesus asks His followers to 1) Turn a cheek, 2) Walk an extra mile, 3) Give away the shirt off your back. What kind of strength does this kind of loving require? It takes the grace of God and our surrendering to its good. Not surprisingly, when Jesus calls a disciple, He says, "Deny yourself and take up your cross" (Matt 16:24). Jesus shows this personal strength Himself in accepting crosses for the good of others, every time He serenely accepts humiliations for the redemption of His aggressors. For example, we see him go through exactly those three cases, first, when He 1) did not smart off back to the governors/high priest who mistreated him (John 18:23), secondly when 2) He walked His own cross to Calvary (John 19:17), and for the third, when 3) He was even stripped completely of His own clothes (John 19:23). Why would Jesus act this way? Because Jesus is not about saving face, saving steps or saving laundry, He is about saving people, even His aggressors. Jesus wants His adversary to be redeemed also. This benevolent and wise attitude of Jesus is like something my mother would say when we brothers wanted to fight/argue with each other. She would say, "You can win that argument, but lose your brother in it". Is any 'win', won in any way, worth losing the person in the process (and maybe them losing their soul)? Maybe a person feels justified in pushing back, demanding rights and clinging to property, but if that is at the expense of losing relationship to them and maybe losing souls, what is really being gained by a 'sweet' vindication? Jesus is revealing the 'high road'. And as they say, "The view is always better from the high road!" We have so many examples in Christian history of Christians Loving an enemy to Christ. I have always wondered about the Temple Guard that Jesus healed in the garden of Gethsemane by reattaching his ear (Luke 22:51). By healing this armed adversary, Jesus had to make a deep impression on the man, so perhaps he converts to Christ's way afterward. With God, all things are possible (Matt 19:26). We see it for sure, in St Stephen's life as Saul witnesses Stephen's Christlike forgiveness of enemies, and himself converting later (Acts Apostles 7:60-8:1). Many saints reveal the saving effects of loving an aggressor! One recent saint (around 1900) St Maria Goretti converted her own killer Alessandro Serenelli. He even went on to testify to her heroic virtue at her beatification inquiry! She had spoken words of forgiveness to him and promised prayer for his eternal soul! Conversion happens! By the grace of God and God working in human holiness, enemies are changed for better! Think about this as a way of how it conversion may come about: If you feel your enemy has no love in them (Why are they so mean? Is there no love in them?), then how will they ever have love in them if it is not shown to them or shared with them by the stronger, more loving person? St John of the Cross describes it this way, "Where there is no love, pour love in, and you will draw out love."

Also, keep in mind that Jesus knows human nature best. He is pragmatic. He knows that insult traded for insult, or a counter- punch for every punch, only continues the selfish escalation of ego-defensiveness with both parties. When does it end? Such 'standoffs' only take you to the ropes or to the ground. When an enemy strikes, Jesus would say you have to go to higher ground (Calvary) to see clearly and understand how to defuse or eliminate the struggle. For example, try opening a door with a clenched fist. Or imagine two battling bucks with antlers locked or two rams with horns tangled? If neither gives/breaks, then they both starve. Jesus' way of forgiveness overcomes such hardheaded obstinacy by revealing the mutual benefit of constructive solutions. To act out of hatred, motivated by vengeance, and to strike back violently, even in defense, can have mutually harmful effects upon both the giver and the recipient. St Paul's tells us in '1 Timothy 6:12 "Fight the good fight of the faith", when the 'good' means the care of both souls----fighting for the good of enemy and oneself. Paul will say in Ephesians 6:11 for us to "Put on the armor of God", and in Ephesians 6:17 to 'take on the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." 'Good' prepares for 'good' victories! And Christians are not all alone in seeking victory through peace and goodness. We can find elements of Jesus' teaching to love enemies in other spiritual traditions if we look for it, such as when Mahatma Gandhi says, "An eye for an eye leads to a blind world". Similarly, Sun-Tzu taught that the 'Supreme art of war is to subdue the enemy without fighting, because victorious warriors win first and then may go to war, while defeated warriors go to war first and futilely seek to win there.' Good, wins for everyone.
