Comrades and Friends!

June is the last month of the Legion's fiscal and business year. New Post, District, Area, Department and National officers, books and policies begin as of July 1.

Naturally most Legionnaires do not have much interest in Legion matters beyond those they recognize as clearly affecting their Post, their membership, and their Veteran benefits. But Legion matters beyond the Post level can greatly affect each of you. The PACT Act went up the chain of command to the National Legion and then to our national Congress where it was finally passed and impacts so many Veterans. Other locally inspired and pressed resolutions go upward every year and get passed by our Department Convention and then by the National Convention.

We in Post 132 are within the Legion's 29th District, its Area 5, and the Department of California. California's Convention will be in Visalia (its Convention Center) from June 21 through 25. There will be meetings of all the many Department Commissions and Committees. Resolutions will be presented and considered there – some very important – and some will be passed by the Convention and then come before the National Convention August 25 through 31. Some of those resolutions will greatly affect veterans and Legionnaires. Post 132 is the second largest post in District 29 and is entitled to vote a substantial number of Convention Delegates but **Post 132 MUST have delegates PRESENT at the Convention to actually vote**! Post 132 MUST send some delegates to Visalia for the Convention to voice and vote our interests. As you may know, I will be there and hope to be elected the Department Vice Commander for Area 5. In that position, I hope to set the tone for how the Legion operates and prioritizes among the five districts of Area 5 including our own District 29. **Please, if you are able, be at the Convention at least for June 23 and 24 when the voting takes place**.

This will also be my final month as the Commander of our District 29 (i.e., Orange County). D29's Bylaws bar me from serving a third term. I want to express my thanks to all who have helped me and the District these past two terms with the many needs and requirements of and for a successful District. Post 132 has always been there for the District and its commander and that is known to all involved and especially me.

We also have at least three important dates to remember this month: June 6, "D-Day", when in 1944 the Allies invaded Northwestern Europe for the final push against the Axis Powers. Mere words cannot describe the horror of that campaign but it must be forever remembered so it never is required again. June 14, 247th birthday of the US Army, founded June 14, 1775. June 18: Father's Day. My best wishes to all of you fathers and grandfathers, natural and by assumption.

Remember our mutual commitment to the Preamble to the American Legion Constitution and the Legion's Four Pillars (Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation; National Security; Americanism; Children & Youth); and most of all remember our commitment to our National Constitution and Country though if you are a Veteran, that reminder is normally not necessary.

Post 132 continues to operate ever mindful of any and all legalities. Should you become aware of some potential legal problem for the Post, please inform me at your earliest opportunity so it can be addressed. If I can be of any help to you, feel free to contact me 24/7/365.

STORIES FROM THE 1917 WALL



Bates Sidney Dewey, Jr. was born in Bakersfield, California on November 27, 1897, the son of Bates T. Dewey, Sr. and his wife Sylvia. Originally from Indiana, the Bates family had settled in California where Bates Sr. worked as a farmer. Bates Jr. was the youngest of three siblings.

The Dewey family mainly resided in Kern, California, with a brief residency in Orange, where in 1917 Bates graduated Orange Union High School (whose buildings are now occupied by Chapman University). His World War I draft card, filled out in September 1918, about nine months after the US entered the war, described him as a selfemployed rancher living in Orange.

There isn't a lot of documentation about Bates' military service. He has a record in the U.S. Veterans Administration Master Index, but unlike records of other servicemen we've profiled in the Bugle, there is no enlistment or discharge date listed. The only information listed is his name, birthdate and a very generic mention of "Military service." The uniform he wears in his photo, however, is consistent with men who served in the Army during that era.

There was a curious incident that took place in 1920, when Bates was mistakenly reported as having passed away. Fortunately, the news of his death turned out to be "very much exaggerated."

In 1922, at the age of 25, Bates married Gladys Warren, age 21. The couple was soon blessed with a daughter whom they named Sybil Louise. By 1930,

Bates, his wife and daughter were living in Kern, California where Bates worked for an oil company.

By 1940, Bates and family were still in Kern, but instead of in the oil industry, Bates was working as a cotton ginner for the Coberly West Ginning Company. In 1947, Bates' daughter Sybil left home to get married, leaving Bates and Gladys as empty nesters.

Time moved steadily onward, and in 1980, Gladys, to whom Bates was married for 58 years, passed away. About five-and-a-half years later, on April 24, 1986, Bates passed away in Bishop, California at the age of 88. We were unable to locate any information about the final place of rest for either Bates or Gladys.

But we offer you our generous thanks, Bates Dewey Jr., for your wartime service to the U.S. Army.


ORANGE BOY IS YET VERY MUCH ALIVE
