

POSTED SPEED LIMITS

The Association Office receives complaints routinely for people driving throughout the Community and exceeding the posted speed limits. The Louisa County Sheriff's Department has been most helpful in their attempts to resolve this problem. They have jurisdiction to write summons for speeding or reckless driving on Association Roads and the results go into Louisa County General District Court and if found guilty those results will be posted with DMV and appear on your Virginia Driver's License Records.

The Sheriff's Department has assured us of enhanced efforts to resolve these problems and will be placing Deputies in the areas of complaint. Please be considerate of yourself and others as it relates to the potential consequences of traveling too fast within the Community.

REMINDER: All Members and Registered Renters are responsible for their guests and their actions.

Did you know leaves can harm our lake?

Phosphorus in our lake can come from leaves. Raking leaves into the lake, or water flowing through leaf piles in our streets create a "leaf tea" that is rich in dissolved phosphorus. Too much phosphorus can lead to toxic algae blooms, low oxygen levels, and green murky waters, none of which are good for animals living in the water or those of us who use it for recreation. Don't LEAF the LAKE!

Revision to ByLaws, Article IV, Section 2, Guests

A gentle reminder of revisions to the Guest Policy as approved by the Board of Directors during their August and September, 2017 meetings and the two bold sentences contain those revisions:

<u>Section 2. Guests:</u> Each Member or Non Member Occupant shall have the right to extend guest privileges, but, subject to such regulations as may be adopted by the Board. Members and Non Member Occupants are at all times responsible and will be held accountable for their actions of their guests. Guest actions may result in complaints submitted to the General Manager, Compliance Committee, or Board of Directors potentially resulting in the member incurring a fee or a loss of privileges. Any individual who gains access to Blue Ridge Shores via the member access in any manner shall be considered the Member's guest. **Any member or Non Member Occupant extending guest privileges will either accompany their guests to the common area being used or send an email to the office with the guest's name, number of people with them and type of vehicle being driven. Visitors not accompanied or identified by email will be asked to leave by the General Manger or his/her designee.**

Water Meter Disconnects for Non-Payment

Water meter disconnects for the 4th qtr. 2017 bill will take place on 2/15/18. RU provides customers with ample opportunity to avoid disconnection of their water service. It is the customer's responsibility to be accountable for making payment on their account in a timely manner.

Should the customers find themselves in need of a payment arrangement it is imperative that the customer make such request immediately. Once services are disconnected the account balance must be paid in full including late charges and reconnect fee before services will be restored. Water service is only reconnected Monday through Friday 6:30 a.m. to 2:15 p.m.

Prevent Frozen Pipes – Winterize Your Home Plumbing


During the very frigid temperatures last winter we had several instances of pipes freezing and then bursting because homeowners did not winterize their home plumbing. If you are going to be away from your residence for an extended period of time please winterize your system. If You Suspect a Frozen Pipe

The cold weather season is upon us bringing about the possibility of frozen pipes. If you open a faucet and no water comes out, don't take any chances. If you suspect a frozen pipe call a plumber and if you are residing in the home, leave a faucet open slightly until the water flows.. If a water pipe bursts, turn off the water at the main line cut-off valve and the house cut-off valve; leave the faucet(s) open until repairs are completed. Don't try to thaw a pipe with an open flame as this could damage the pipe and may even start a fire.

Please report any trees on association property needing attention that we may have missed.



General Manager's Report

Denny W. Kelly

We have enjoyed working with the membership during the past year and look forward to working with your needs in 2018. We are extremely pleased with the sixth consecutive year of less than 5% delinguency report for assessment collections. Our collections % for 2017 was 95.8% and all but three members honored their commitments for the partial payment agreements. This also included collecting approximately \$20,498.08 in previous years' delinquencies. Appropriate liens and judgments were filed on those members that did not pay and they were declared to be MNIGS. Please review your 2018 invoice for accuracy and contact us immediately for any necessary corrections. I urge those that wish to sign up for a Partial Payment Agreement to do that early, in order to avoid higher monthly payments.

Please be careful in the morning and afternoons where school children are loading/unloading from the buses and walking to or from home. Just a gentle reminder to all that the speed limit throughout the community, **is 25 MPH.** When the school bus has red lights on, vehicles are to remain stopped until those are turned off!

Remember nothing can be placed in the Lake including leaves without Board permission.

When you have building materials, furniture, or fuel delivered, your septic system serviced, or perhaps a moving type vehicle come to your home, please remember the gross vehicle weight cannot exceed five tons on the dam/spillway area or twenty-five tons on the Hickory Creek Bridge. It is imperative that material or service delivery adhere to those weight limits and adjust their entry into the Community according to their destination and be provided with that type of information.

RU has winterization tips in the office and on their website, should you need guidance. It is a good idea to turn off the valve on the water meter in addition to the inside valve if you close the house for the winter. Ridge Utilities is very pleased to announce that all required 2017 VDH testing of the water was completed with a 100% passing of those requirements. Occasionally we have a leak in one of the mains and when you observe that you do not have water, please turn the electrical breaker off to your water heater. This prevents possible damage to the heating elements. If you notice a decrease in water pressure or availability, you may have a leak. Check the water meter and if the usage dial is spinning without normal usage there is a leak.

Should you witness any activity that appears unlawful contact the Sheriff's Department immediately. Your identity will not be disclosed by them. The Sheriff's Department is currently assisting by monitoring the speed of vehicles on the roadways and activities during the school bus stop related activities. This also includes stray dogs. Their non-emergency # is 967-1234.

The BRPOA/RU employees are very diligent about their responsibilities and equally proud of the work they do for both corporations. They are multitalented, possess a tremendous amount of corporate knowledge, and strive to make Blue Ridge Shores a better place to live. We work together to resolve problems/issues and their energy and dedication levels pleases me very much!

During 2018 there will be a tremendous amount of effort and energy placed on Compliance Issues/ Violations. For Example there are several temporary shed devices that have been recently erected and these are not items that can be installed or approved.

The dredging project is essentially complete, however it became too late in the season to attempt asphalt repairs on North Lakeshore Drive near Clearwater Lane. That steel plate in the road will be removed in the late spring and a proper patch installed.
