It helps to keep in mind that a lot of changes are good. The change from our crumbling parking lot to our new, smooth, freshly marked pavement at church is a big change and a good change!

The freshly painted walls, the steeple that no longer leaks, the people who are new to our church fellowship... changes, but *good* changes!

So there are two changes that we think can help us work more successfully and could really simplify things at First Baptist Church. And you should be hearing about these in more detail very soon.

The first change is a new budget format. In our current format we have line items that we long ago stopped doing. And there are

things we do every year, but we never know where to take those expenses in our current budget. And sometimes it's hard to figure out where a line item is in our jumble of categories.

So the new budget format is built around 6 great priorities, and one "enabling" resource.

The 6 priorities are Missions, Worship, Discipleship, Outreach, Ministry, and Fellowship. These are the things God has commanded us to do as a church. So each one has a category in the budget.

And the one "enabling" resource is simply called "Support." Our office operations, properties, and personnel are sub-categories of this "how we get it done" section.

It will make a lot more sense when you see it, but we wanted to let you know it's coming for your study and comments.

The second big change was the new approach to deacon ministry

that we presented in last month's newsletter. Our deacons have discussed it and decided that they would like to see us move in that direction. So as soon as they sign off on the specifics, we'll share that approach with you... again for your study and comments.

Stay tuned for these two items, and please don't hesitate to ask questions or make suggestions before they are brought to the church conference for a vote!




