

Music Ministry

Who is the principle music minister? Music ministers might imagine that the music director, the cantor, or the organist is the principle minister of music. Some choir members may see themselves as the ones who provide music for the liturgy. In many ways these are true. But two references in our liturgical documents give us a different way of understanding who the primary music ministers in our assemblies are. Liturgical Music Today says, "The entire worshiping assembly exercises a ministry of music". Second, Sing to the Lord states that the congregation's unrehearsed community singing "is the primary song of the Liturgy". Father Tom recently brought this article excerpt to my attention and I think it reminds us of that active participation that we are supposed to have not just in singing, but in all parts of the Mass. We don't come to Mass as observers like at a movie or a sporting event, but as participants. This participation is a gift for us because it helps us grow in holiness, but it is also a gift to our brothers and sisters who are uplifted and inspired by our example.

Tuesday evening choir practice will resume Tuesday, September 3rd from 6-7:30 pm. All are welcome to attend and offer their voice to enhance our worship at our parish. Our next musician's scheduling meeting will be Tuesday August 27th at 5:30 pm before the Musician's Potluck.

Diocesan Bulletin Bite:

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!"

Starting fires and setting relatives against each other seems like rather harsh words from the mouth of Jesus who consistently lived and taught what God told Moses to tell the Chosen People - to love God with our whole heart, mind, soul and strength; and to love our neighbors as ourselves. If we read the words of Jesus in the bright light of his life and teachings, we will understand that he does not intend or desire for families and others be divided. But Jesus was aware that if we chose to follow and imitate him by loving people and using things to demonstrate that love would be rejected and abused by family and others who cling to cultural attitudes of selfishness that loves things and uses people. The blaze Jesus wished had already started is the fire of love that burns away self-centeredness and makes way for love of others. That blaze flickers in our world but Jesus expects us to make that fire much brighter by loving our neighbor as ourselves. Imagine a world on fire with such love. Imagine us as the source of that fire.
