

The Ralston City Council met in a regular session on Tuesday, October 20, 2015 at 7:00 P.M. at Ralston City Hall. Roll was called with the following present: Konwinski, Fideline, Alberhasky, Krause, Sanchez, and Preis. Groesser was absent. The agenda for this meeting was available at City Hall for public inspection and posted prior to the meeting. The legal notice for the meeting was published in the Ralston Recorder. Claims listed are approved and a part of these minutes.

Krause gave the Acknowledgement of Open Meeting Law Posting.

It was moved to approve the Consent Agenda, minus Maria's claims, by Konwinski, seconded by Alberhasky. All vote yes, motion carries. It was moved to approve Maria's claims by Konwinski, seconded by Preis. Sanchez abstains. All others vote yes, motion carries.

Costanzo reported that lottery came in at \$72 thousand before taxes and said the budget has been rolled. Klinker reported that letters went out to all of the restaurants in town on the passage of the restaurant tax, which goes into effect November 1<sup>st</sup>. Klinker said, regarding questions from the last meeting, the language is clear enough in the ordinance for the tax that it does include catering businesses. Murtaugh said "No Shave November" has kicked off early this year, where officers can pay \$30.00 to not shave during November. Murtaugh said half of the money will go to Project Harmony and half will go to the Salvation Army. Murtaugh said they will be starting the Diaper Drive, where all diapers donated will go to the Lydia House. Murtaugh said the department received an anonymous donation of \$100.00 for anything the officers needed, and they decided they would like to sponsor a family for Thanksgiving. Murtaugh reported that Officer Gross completed Accident Reconstructionist training, which was paid for with grant funds through Highway Safety. Murtaugh said the Department of Roads will have a Public Hearing at the library on November 3<sup>rd</sup> from 4:00 to 6:00 regarding the 84<sup>th</sup> Street viaduct project. Canfield said the Lunch and Learn on Wednesday will feature Author Lawson McDowell who wrote the book Ginny Cooper's War, which is the history of the women who built the B-29's for WWII in Omaha. Benis reported on the Lancers upcoming games and on the upcoming Gaither event and Mercy Me, which are selling well. Benis said, in light of the ticket issue with Taylor Swift, the arena is updating their ticket printing policies in the box office. Yochum reported that Ralston Studio Space at the corner of 77<sup>th</sup> & Park Dr. had an open house last week and they now have 7 photographers instead of the originally planned 3. Yochum said LifeCare Associates has moved into the office building at 7877 L St.

Consideration of Special Designated License for Randall Charf, DBA Bushwacker's, for November 7, 2015 from 10:00 AM to 2:00 AM was spoken to by Murtaugh. Murtaugh said this is for a tailgate party and he has no objection to the SDL. It was moved for approval by Konwinski, seconded by Fideline. All vote yes, motion carries.

Consideration of Special Designated License for Hatt Boys Inc., DBA Village Bar for December 6, 2015 from 12:00 PM to 2:00 AM. Murtaugh said this is an annual fund raiser with Hit That Dive, and he has no objection to the SDL. It was moved for approval by Konwinski, seconded by Sanchez. All vote yes, motion carries.

Consideration of Application for Keno Satellite Permit from Hatt Boys Inc., DBA Village Bar was spoken to by Keith Lewis, Ralston Keno. Lewis said this will be a self-service kiosk where the customer will write their own tickets. It was moved for approval by Fideline, seconded by Alberhasky. All vote yes, motion carries.

Public Comments: Jeffrey Gaudreault, 3804 Farman, asked Council to reinstate his privilege to the Baright Library. Krause said they would discuss the issue with the police department and send him a letter to let him know.

Council Comments: Sanchez wished his 7 year old son, Miles, who is sitting in the back, Happy Birthday.

There being nothing further of a general nature to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 7:18 PM.
