




SAINT AUGUSTINE'S: The geothermal heating and cooling deal was signed on August 11th and work started this week. This project is expected to take four to five months. Therefore, we take this opportunity to remind parishioners we started a fundraising campaign three months ago to ensure we have a safe, comfortable and energy-efficient building to pursue our mission for many more years. In addition to the geothermal project, the other key capital expenditures are: Energy-efficient lighting, replacing the front steps, paving the parking lot, and refinishing the pews

and exterior doors. Your Campaign Fundraising Team set a goal of \$400,000; with \$45,600 raised to date, we have \$354,400 to raise.

Our goals include getting more parishioners on pre-authorized debit (PAD) and to increase their weekly contribution by 20% and/or to give one-time donations. Campaign envelopes are at the back of the church. Thank you to those who have already contributed.



2021-2022 Faith Development Registration

Registrations for the biweekly sessions of faith development for St. Augustine's and St. Lawrence O'Toole will be taking place on Sunday, Sept. 12th from 12:15 – 1:15 pm in the church basement of St. Augustine's. Our faith development program is available for children entering grade 1 thru grade 6 in school this September.

Please use the door at the top of the stairs in the parking lot, proceeding downstairs to the basement. In keeping with our Covid-19 protocols, we ask that you maintain proper social distancing while gathered in the basement. We also ask that only one parent/adult be present for the registration so to minimize the

number of people enabling us to maintain the proper social distancing during the registration.

Online registration forms are also available by visiting our website at www.qasmoncton.com opening the tab for Faith Development and use the form for faith development. You can submit the form online or print the form (using the word or pdf document) and drop it off at our office or place it in the collection basket at mass. Please be advised that, in accordance with our diocesan policy, there is a fee of \$30 per child or \$50 per family (2 children or more) to be paid at the time of registration. We can only accept cash or cheques made payable to St. Augustine's. No debit, credit or etransfer available. For those registering online, payment will be accepted at our first session. Please note that, at this time, registration will only be taken for our biweekly faith development program.



The Classics of Catholic Spirituality

Thomas à Kempis The Imitation of Christ

"Egotism, Materialism, Hedonism." This seems to be the slogan that typifies the temperament of the modern world. What can a fifteenth-century spiritual treatise possibly have to say to such a mindset? The answer: Everything.



The three central themes of the Imitation of Christ stand as the antithesis to the fixations of the contemporary psyche, and provide an antidote for them. Although the work attributed to Thomas à Kempis was originally written for a community of religious priests, its message reaches beyond that audience right into our present day malaise. It does so by teaching us authoritatively about true self-love, detachment, and suffering.

A prevalent trendy truism contends that, to insure psychological well-being, we must "love ourselves." Unfortunately, the popular bent interprets this claim as an excuse for indulgence, irresponsibility, and moral license. However, as à Kempis rightly points out: "From this vice of too much self-love comes almost every other vice that must be uprooted....By loving myself badly I lost myself, by seeking only You and by truly loving You I have found both myself and You."

Self-love is crucial to personal wholeness and holiness. But true self-love finds its referent and its source outside of the self and in Jesus Christ. Rectified self-regard requires that we love ourselves the way God loves us. As such, we are not responsible for originating or inaugurating that love. Rather, self-love means allowing Jesus to love us first with his love, as à Kempis testifies: "Left to myself, I am nothing but total weakness. But if you look upon me for an instant, I am at once made strong and filled with new joy."

The key is giving ourselves to God right now just the way we are. Self-love quickens in us through the conviction that we are lovable solely because of the goodness of God. The only gift that God desires of us in this moment is our actual being with all its imperfection. God wants us to realize that he desires nothing from us that he has not first given us. "You are what you are, and you cannot be said to be better than you are in God's sight."



You are no longer required to call and register for Mass. Masks are not mandatory but recommended. Physical distancing is not required, thus, the church can be filled.











