Good Friday, Easter and the Feasts of Israel

"For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed." 1 Corinthians 5:7 See Leviticus 23

Most Christians have some awareness of the connection of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ with the Feast of Passover. Passover was the first feast on the Jewish religious calendar. It commemorated the departure of the Hebrews from Egypt when they were saved from the angel of death by applying the blood of an unblemished lamb upon the doorpost of their homes. Jesus was the perfect lamb of God whose death delivers us from sin. But we likewise must apply the blood to the doorpost of our lives to be saved from eternal death.

We may not be so clear about the connections that we Christians have to the other Jewish feasts. Immediately following the Passover was the Feast of Unleavened Bread, which lasted for seven days. This commemorated the haste with which the Hebrews had to leave Egypt. They did not have time to leaven their bread. For Christians salvation involves a challenge to flee from sin and begins a kind of wandering in the world as we seek to follow Christ and await our arrival in the promised land.

The third feast of the Jewish calendar happened during the Feast of Unleavened Bread. It was the Feast of Firstfruits. On that day the first sheaf of the barley crop would be cut down and waved before the Lord, signifying that the rest of the crop was now ready to be taken in. On that first Easter Sunday morning as Jesus was rising from the dead, priests had gone outside of Jerusalem to cut down a sheaf of barley. They waved it before the Lord in the Temple. Meanwhile Jesus became the firstfuits of those risen from the dead, signifying that a future harvest of believers would follow.

Seven weeks later came the Feast of Weeks (Shavuot), or Pentecost. Two loaves of bread were presented as a wave offering, marking the beginning of the wheat harvest. In Jewish tradition it is also celebrated as the giving of the Law of Moses on Mt. Sinai. In the New Testament the Holy Spirit comes upon Christians on Pentecost, marking the beginning of the Church. The new era is marked by grace rather than law. Many Christians see the two loaves of the original feast as signifying Jews and Gentiles who are brought together in the body of Christ.

Rosh Hashanna is the first day of the seventh month and marks New Years Day in the civil calendar. A trumpet is blown to announce the beginning of this holy month. The Jewish Talmud says that the resurrection of the dead will occur on this day. In 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 a trumpet sounds when the rapture of the church occurs and when Israel begins a special period of testing.

The Day of Atonement happens on the tenth day of the month. Religious Jews regard this as a day when repentance and mourning over sin should occur. After the seven year Tribulation begins, the Book of Revelation and other passages indicate that a spiritual revival and a turning to Jesus will occur among the Jews.

The last feast is Succoth, or the Feast of Tabernacles, or the Feast of Ingathering, celebrated this same month from Tishri 15-22. It marks the final harvest of the year. People live in booths to remember their wandering in the wilderness. But they also have a great celebration as they mark the completion of the final harvest. We Christians find a fulfillment of this feast in the Millennium, when a great feast will happen upon the earth and Christ will rule for a thousand years in an earthly kingdom.





Tickets are \$10 each and will be sold on Sundays, April 23rd - April 30 - May 7.


