Bilocating Lady in Blue

Vatican officials are collecting evidence to document the case for the canonization of an incorruptible and bilocating Spanish nun, Maria of Jesus of Agreda, responsible for evangelizing Native Americans in the 1600s.

Reverend Stefano Cecchin, vice postulator of the Friars Minor, spent a week in San Angelo, Texas in early August and spoke with members of the Lady in Blue Committee. Members of this group spent years documenting the testimony of the Jumanos peoples who claim to have been visited by the Lady in Blue between 1622 and 1625, bilocating from Spain to the New World. Bilocation is the ability to be in two places at once. Venerable Mary of Agreda was a Spanish nun, abbess, writer and spiritual director to Philip IV of Spain. She never physically left her village north of Madrid, and Cecchin says he has seen the Spanish records documenting the proof of her bilocation's to Texas. There are many eyewitness accounts from priests and laymen alike describing her "trances," where she would become light as a feather and blow about by the lightest breeze. On waking from these states, she would have complete recall of details of the geography of the area she visited, including being able to embroider the birds and flowers on vestments. She would also recall meeting the peoples and missionaries where she went. She says Our Lord inspired her to pray for the Indians of New Spain so that their souls would not be lost.

In the three years she was reported to have traveled to "New Spain," she appeared at least 500 times to the peoples of Quivairas, Jumanas

and other areas that are today located in New Mexico, Texas and Arizona. She reported several times suffering torture and being left for dead by the Indians who were provoked to violence by their witch doctors. She would come to her senses in her convent with no injuries or marks from the attacks. She would then re-appear to the astonished Indians to preach again.

Her cause for canonization has been underway for 400 years. Virtually every pope from Innocent to Pius VI worked on her canonization, meeting with opposition and difficulties. Part of the difficulties in Agreda's canonization process was that for some time the Inquisition placed an embargo on her book *Mystical City of God*.

The Lady in Blue is also credited with bringing the iconic Texas Bluebell to the area. After her last visit to the Jumanos, she was elevated in the air until she disappeared. The next day the never-before-seen blue flowers appeared. The Jumanos had the impression that wherever her blue cloak trailed on the ground, the flowers grew. Her incorrupt body is preserved in the Church of the Conceptionists in Agreda, Spain.

Señora de Azul

Los oficiales del Vaticano están colectando evidencias para documentar el caso de la canonización de una monja española incorruptible y que aparecía en dos diferentes lugares a la misma vez, María de Jesús de Agreda, responsable por la evangelización de los Nativos Americanos en los años 1600.

El Reverendo Stefano Cecchin, vice postulado de los Frailes Menores, paso un semana en San Ángelo, Texas, a principios de agosto y hablo con los miembros del comité de la Señora de Azul. Los miembros de este grupo pasaron anos documentando el testimonio de los Jumanos quienes clamaban haber sido visitados por la Señora de Azul entre los años 1622 y 1625, estando en dos diferentes lugares desde España hasta el Nuevo Mundo. Las bilocaciones es la habilidad de estar en dos lugares al mismo tiempo. La venerable María de Agreda era una monja española, abadesa, escritora y directora espiritual de Felipe IV rey de España. Ella nunca dejo físicamente su aldea al norte de Madrid, y Cecchin dice que él ha visto la documentación de los reportes españoles documentando las pruebas de su bilocación en Texas. Hay muchos testigos vinculares desde sacerdotes hasta laicos que describen sus "trances," en donde ella se volvía tan livianita como una pluma y se dejaba volar por la más ligera brisa. Al despertar de este estado, ella tenía recuerdos completos y detallados de la geografía del área que ella visitaba, incluyendo el ser capaz de bordar los pájaros y flores sobre las vestiduras de los sacerdotes. Ella también recordaba encontrarse con la gente y con los misioneros a donde ella iba. Ella dice que Nuestro Señor la inspiraba a orar por los indios de la Nueva España para que sus almas no se perdieran.

En los tres años que se había reportado haber viajado a la "Nueva España," ella se apareció cuando menos unas 500 veces a la gente de Quivairas, Jamúas y en otras áreas que ahora están ubicadas en Nuevo México, Texas y Arizona. Ella reporto varias veces haber sufrido torturas y haber sido dada por muerta por los indios que eran provocados a la violencia por sus brujos curanderos. Ella volvía a sus cinco sentidos en su convento sin ninguna lastimadura o marca de los ataques. Ella entonces re-aparecía ante los atónitos indios para predicarles de nuevo. Su causa para la canonización se ha estado llevando a cabo por 400 años. Virtualmente cada papa desde el Papa Inocente hasta el Papa Pio VI trabajaron para su canonización, encontrándose con oposiciones y dificultades. Parte de las dificultades en la canonización de Agreda era que por algún tiempo la inquisición puso un embargo en su libro *Ciudad Mística de Dios*.

A la Señora de Azul se le acredita con traer a Texas la icónica Campana Azul. Después de su última visita a los Jumanos, ella fue elevada en el aire hasta que desapareció. Al próximo día los flores azules nunca antes vistas aparecieron. Los Jumanos tuvieron la impresión que por dondequiera que su túnica tocaba la tierra, las flores crecían. Su cuerpo incorrupto se preserva en la Iglesia de los Concepcionistas en Agreda, España.
