Program Description

Digital Multimedia program consists of a sequence of courses. During the first year, students will take Computer 1 & 2, which exposes students to basic and advanced concepts of Microsoft Word, EXCEL, Access, and PowerPoint. Students will also produce creative and advanced desktop publishing documents, spreadsheets, databases and electronic presentations with animation.

The advanced level includes Web Design and Concepts, Game Programming or Programming in Visual Basic courses. In the Web Design and Concepts course, students will use multimedia elements such as graphics, audio files, video files and animation in a web page.

The Game Programming course will introduce techniques using the programming language Java Script. In the Programming in Visual Basic course, students will learn the fundamentals of programming using visual basic programming language as well as the commands and logic involved in designing, decoding, and debugging programs.
