OIL CITY, LA - Priscilla Thompson Weaver, 57, passed away on Sunday, April 11, 1999 at her residence after a long and courageous battle with cancer. Funeral services will be held Tuesday, April 13, 1999 at 4 p.m. at the First Baptist Church of Oil City with Rev. Jeff Hoffman officiating. Burial will follow at Lakeview Memorial Gardens in Oil City.
