Steady Servants in a Chaotic World

—Methods are shifting rapidly but the mission does not change.

This is the "Age of Disruption." So much of what was rock solid and dependable in the world around us has become shaky ground.

Retail giants like Sears and J.C. Penny whose huge catalogs we flipped through each Christmas season are filing for bankruptcy, victims of online shopping and changing retail expectations.

Newspapers, the solid news source of daily life, survived the arrival of TV, but they are crumbling from the shift to digital news sources.

The trusted institutions of the past like banks and, yes, churches, have fallen prey to scandals, quick profit schemes, and cover-ups so that they are now viewed with distrust.

Opposition groups in society and government, rather than offering better ideas, just work to disrupt those they oppose, and disrupt life in general, creating chaos, riots, violence, and paralysis.

Parents were the guardians over what children were exposed to. But now children as young as elementary age have the best and worst of the whole world in their pockets on their smart phones. We taught our children "don't get in the car with strangers" but the Uber and Lyft ride sharing system have 6 million people getting into cars with strangers every day.

We were careful about who we let into our homes, but through AirBnB, hundred of thousands of hosts welcome strangers into their homes daily.

At the end of the day, you used to clock out and leave work behind. But now, with laptops and cell phones, you are available to the company 24 hours a day.

In the past, politicians argued and disagreed and then hammered out a compromise. Today they practice character assassination, work to silence any voice that disagrees, and enrich themselves from the billions and trillions in tax dollars that pass through their control.

In the past, we knew who the enemy was and where the battlefield was. But in the age of disruption, the terrorist can bring the war to any stadium, any shopping mall, any venue of daily life.

The world that young adults are navigating today is foreign to so many of us. So how do we proclaim Christ and minister in the Age of Disruption? ...but at the same time, make sure the disruptive world does not disrupt our faith?

It would be easy to withdraw, to let the world "go to hell" while we hide in our church buildings. But that's not our calling from Christ.

The simplest answer is that we need to demonstrate the reaching love of Christ on the face-to-face level. We will have little impact if we try to change society as a whole, but we can have an impact that lasts for generations if we introduce one parent or couple to Jesus. We can move that one family from disruption to unchanging truth and unshakable joy.

In this disrupted world, our methods will have to change. We cannot reach today's generations with yesterday's methods. But the needs of the human heart have not changed, and our message has not changed.

In Jesus alone we find the truth that sets us free and the forgiving love that makes us children of God. He alone is Peace, Hope, and Life. He disrupts the disruption!


