<u>Pastor's Corner</u> - Keeping the Essence of Christmas in our Observance of Epiphany

So, I have something to say ... "<u>It's still Christmas</u>" ... now I'm seeing the opposite of what I rolled my eyes at on November 1st (people decorating for Christmas well before Advent) ... but it's just January 1st and people seem to be "done with Christmas" – but it's too early to "take it down" because (to start) the Christmas season doesn't end until January 6th. But more than that, as the Church, our reason for being is to show the world around us, the gift that came at Christmas is still with us, and God isn't taking it back to the "Returns" Dept. like so many do in January.

Let me share something that *comes with Christmas* that shouldn't be 'put away' – the Gospels say that Christ's coming was '*good news to the poor*.' If you've received God's gift in Christ, how will you continue to share good news with the poor? This is about WAY more than donating the clothes you got at Christmas that don't fit to Goodwill, or the odd items you got from your eccentric relative (or the fruit cake) – "Fruit-caking" should be made a word, so we tell people not to do it. My point is: we have ministry partners – like *AVAC* (Allegheny Valley Association of Churches) and *TryLife* – that need regular support *through the year*

as they endeavor to give good news and grace to the poor. The Outreach Team continues to share some of these. In addition to things like the *Bottle Campaigns* and *Diaper Drives*, they need volunteers willing to give a more personal time investment. For example, *TryLife's* requesting different church groups to come and do a once-a-month sorting/cleaning of their toys and supplies – even if we had 4 groups from Puckety volunteer *once a quarter* (e.g., 2 small groups take two, and add two sign-up times, etc.), that would be a great blessing.

I read something recently that fits here: "Needs are all around us. But in the long term, people do not really give themselves to needs; they give themselves to visions – particularly the ones with God behind them, like Moses' vision of liberation & freedom, Nehemiah's vision of rebuilding, or Isaiah's vision of peace. People want to be part of something bigger than themselves." (O.S. Hawkins, *The Nehemiah* Code, italics mine).

But we become part of 'the something bigger' by starting with some specific 'small things.' There really are multiple things that so many our members could help with – to be clear: these opportunities aren't primarily for the people on the Church committees – the people on the committees sponsor these so that the *people of the church*, all the *members and friends* in our ranks can fulfill our Vision – "to be the heart, voice and hands of God, making a lasting difference in your life, the community and the world." So, whether you sign up to be a driver to help the weekly Meals on Wheels ministry out of Faith Hall, or work with members from other local churches to help tutor students in our Burrell district schools, or help incorporate a broader service element into the annual Easter Egg hunt, there's so many ways for the various members of Christ's body to use their various gifts. So, sure, feel free to take the tree down, but put something else in its place ... As we move into Epiphany – which has to do with God being made manifest – essentially "showing up in surprising ways" – listen to how God's Spirit is moving you, so that God can use you to act in surprising ways for the benefit of others. God bless you. ~ Pastor Brian~

A Devotional For You - Read Isaiah 63:7-9 & Matthew 2:13-23

Picture this *Peanuts* cartoon with me: Lucy walks up to Charlie Brown on Christmas Day and says to him, "Charlie Brown, since it's Christmas, I suggest we lay aside our differences and be friends today." Charlie says, "That's a great idea, Lucy, but why does it have to be just at Christmas? Why can't we be friends all year long?" Lucy looks at him with that look that only Lucy can give and says, "What are you, a fanatic or something?!"

I suppose many of us would like to hold on to Christmas a little longer, some might call us fanatics (and I'm not just talking about keeping the lights on the outside of the house up until St. Patrick's Day). Though Dec. 25th has come and gone, I would like to see us hold on to the Christmas spirit just a bit longer. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we kept practicing the things we sing about at Christmastime? [Maybe that's why we *practice* them] ... And the amazing thing is – in those songs, hard things like 'darkness' ... and 'peril' ... even 'death' are mentioned in those carols ... but for some reason, they're better than the holiday songs, right? Because the holiday songs don't help much when we've had multiple family members die in the month of December over the past few years ... The "Fa La La" songs don't help a lot when the shopping bills come due, or the heating bill reminds us why there couldn't be much of a shopping bill. The carols (and 'Christmas practice') are important because we've been touched by darkness and death ... "long lay the world in sin and error pining" – life has NOT been easy. *But* ... As Scripture says, "But at just the right time, God sent his Son, born of a virgin, born under the law, to rescue those under the burden of the law." Jesus gives us the solid foundation to stand, the strength to endure, and even overcome.

Yes, it's time to take down the tree and put the decorations back in storage for another year. But, please God, may the music linger. May the songs (the timeless and perennial songs) of hope, and peace and goodwill be forever in our hearts. May our homes be filled with the fragrances, sounds and promises of Christmas, forever. May we take its message with us (because we need it all the year through) and so we can share it with others so the world may be touched by it, as we have been touched by it. Howard Thurman wrote, "When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone from sight, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, then the real work of Christmas begins ... to find the lost, heal the broken, feed the hungry, visit the lonely, to bring peace among brothers and sisters, to make music in the heart – the Music of the Master in our lives – that is the real work of Christmas!"
