

### Are You Ready?

It's funny how life works. We started in the ministry almost exactly 20 years ago-August of 1997. A year before that, Joanne and I talked and came to the same conclusion- God was calling us into the ministry. We spent almost a full year (I gave my employer 9 months' notice that I was leaving!) getting ready. In July of that year, I spent two weeks on the campus of Illinois Wesleyan University in Bloomington (My alma mater, by the way!) attending what was then called The License to Preach School. At the end of that 2-week period, assuming you make it through, you are then eligible to be appointed to serve a church as a Licensed Local Pastor.

I finished the class at the end of July, we were appointed to our first church- The Christ United Methodist Church in Fairview Heights, Illinois on August 15 and I started full-time seminary on August 25. The next three years were a blur- full-time student, Associate Pastor at the church, moving to a new community, trying to juggle all of that AND a family. It was a tough 3 years. We then spent four MORE years at that church, post-seminary.

One of the great things we got to be a part of there was exponential church growth. That church grew from 200/week average worship attendance to 800/week average worship attendance in the 7 years we were there. That is an opportunity few pastors have the joy of experiencing. I feel incredibly blessed. We were able to take that "DNA" with us to our next church, where we saw growth as well. (Not NEAR-LY that volume of growth, but growth nonetheless.) And after 8 years there, God brought us here. And again, we have seen growth in the church. It's something I NEVER take for granted, because it's something not every pastor gets to experience firsthand.

If there is anything I have learned from 20 years of church growth, it's that there is a foundational truth to the whole thing. And that foundational truth is this- churches grow, at the end of the day, from one person telling one person. Ad campaigns. Radio spots. TV commercials. Social Media campaigns. Direct mailers. They all have their place. And they all have their impact. But they all pale in comparison to the power of one person telling one person.

When you tell somebody what God has done in your life and follow that up with an invitation to join you at church and see what it's all about, you can radically impact a life. Look at it this way- as I write this, we are averaging 286 people/week in worship attendance. If half of those 286- only HALF- each got ONE person to come to church this year- just ONE, ALL year- that would mean we would see an attendance increase of 50%...in ONE year! If ONLY half brought ONLY one each. That's not only possible, it is infinitely "do-able"!

Do you like what is going on at your church? If you do, then it's time to step up and help us get over the next hurdle. It's time to be like those great theologians The Doobie Brothers and start takin' it to the streets! I have done ALL I can do. We have grown absolutely as much as we CAN grow based on what I can do. BUT- if you are willing to step up, step out and partner with me to help connect more and more people to Jesus Christ- well, the sky's the limit! So...are you ready?

## **PRAYER CHALLENGE**

Charles Haddon Spurgeon was born June 19, 1834 in Kelvedon, United Kingdom. By the time he died on January 31, 1892 in Menton, France, he was known as the "prince of preachers". He was a Baptist minister who saw enormous blessings throughout his ministry. Thousands of people came to Jesus Christ through his preaching. He was known to draw as many as 10,000 people at a time!


But Spurgeon never took credit for the success of his ministry. Instead, he always pointed to a VERY specific thing- the hundreds of people who came before worship services and prayed for God's blessing. He consistently said that any success he had came from God in answer to those prayers. He often referred to those prayer groups as the church's "boiler room."

Think about that- one the preeminent preachers...ever...attributed his success to folks sitting in a room...praying. There is GREAT power in prayer. It is NOT the least we can do- it's the MOST we can do. With that in mind, here's my challenge. I challenge you to spend the next 3 months in prayer. No- I DON'T mean constant prayer! But for the next 3 months, pray for your church. Pray for the new worship service. Pray for the Youth and Children's ministries. Pray for Sunday School and Adult Bible studies. Pray for the 8,000 people in Mercer County who don't have a church home. Pray for...me!

We stand on the threshold of absolutely amazing things. God is moving in powerful ways. How we respond to His call will define where we go from here. And so...we pray. Spurgeon told his fellow pastors, "Brethren, we shall never see much change for the better in our churches in general till the prayer meeting occupies a higher place in the esteem of Christians".

## STAINED GLASS WINDOWS





## FLAG DAY

In the United States, Flag Day is celebrated on June 14th (a Wednesday this year). It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened that day, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress, in 1777. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress. Flag Day is not an official federal holiday, though on June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first (and only) U.S. state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday. The longest-running Flag Day parade is held annually in Quincy, Massachusetts, which began 1952 and will celebrate its 59th year in 2009. The largest Flag Day parade is held annually in Troy, New York, which bases its parade on the Quincy parade and typically draws 50,000 spectators. The week of June 14 is designated as "National Flag



Week." During National Flag Week, the president will issue a proclamation urging U.S. citizens to fly the American flag for the duration of that week. This year, remember the freedom that our flag represents, and thank God for that freedom- including the freedom to worship.

Grace Golden Clayton is believed to have suggested the service to her pastor to commemorate 361 local men killed in a mine explosion. It was not made official until 1966 by President Lyndon Johnson. If you are unable to do either of those things, take a moment to say a prayer to God, thanking Him that your dad helped bring you into this world.

## PLEDGING AND TITHING

#### WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?

At Aledo United Methodist Church, we know that financial stewardship is an important component of a balanced spiritual life. We emphasize the giver's need to give rather than the church's need to receive. Maintaining a healthy relationship with our possessions keeps them from getting in the way of our relationships with God, our neighbors, and our own inner being. Returning to God from that which God has given us is a tangible way to express our faith. When each of us gives as we are able, together we can fund our various ministries in Aledo and around the world.



A pledge is an estimate of giving; some call it a statement of intent. Pledge amount may be changed, increased or decreased during the year, at any time as financial circumstances change.

#### WHY SHOULD I PLEDGE?

Pledging allows us to make intentional decisions about our financial giving. It is all about priorities! When we plan ahead for our giving, we make conscious choices about spending our money in ways that reflect our faith and values. The church sets a budget based largely on the amount of total pledges received. While regular giving that is not pledged is important to the church, our pledges let the church plan more accurately.

#### HOW DO I PLEDGE?

Our annual stewardship campaign is held each January but pledges may be made at any time. Pledge forms are available in the church office.

#### HOW DO I PAY MY PLEDGE?

Paying your pledge is a matter of personal preference. You may pay weekly, monthly, quarterly or yearly via cash, check, Pay Pal, or through your financial institution's bill pay feature.

#### HOW MUCH SHOULD I PLEDGE?

Determining the amount of your annual pledge is between you and God. Only you know what you can give. The dollar amount is not the most important detail of your pledge. We want you to participate. We want you to do the best you can.

#### WHAT IS A TITHE?

A tithe is 10% of your income. A tithe may sound like an unattainable goal to begin with, but if you start with a certain proportion of your income and increase the percentage each year, you will be tithing in a short time. You could start with 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ %, which is equivalent to pledging the first hour's pay of a 40-hour week.

#### HOW WILL I KNOW HOW MUCH I HAVE GIVEN TO THE CHURCH?

The church prepares quarterly statements of giving for everyone that gives to the church.

#### GET STARTED!

The amount of your pledge is not as important as is getting started.

More people are now making their weekly/monthly/yearly offering to your church online! If you go to our home page (www.myaledoumc.com) and choose "giving" from the Navigation Bar near the top, it will take you to a page that will provide the opportunity for you to give electronically. You can either do a one-time gift or a recurring monthly gift.

"Pastor, why would that be good for the church?" Thanks for asking! It's SO easy to forget your checkbook at home one week. It's also so easy to forget to give your offering when you are out of town. But the truth of the matter is that the financial commitments of the church...the bills, if you will...don't decrease on those weeks when people forget to tithe. Our financial commit-

ments are steady all year long. Therefore, having a steady, dependable stream of giving helps us better plan for next week, next month and next year!
