## FAQ

## **License Practical Nursing**

- Q. When is open enrollment and when is the start date?
- A. We accept applications from June 1<sup>st</sup> to November 1<sup>st</sup>. The start date is in the spring semester, January.
- Q. What is considered a complete packet?
- A. A complete packet includes the required documents: application, copy of your ID, social security card, and CNA certification, Accuplacer scores, official High School /official GED Scores, official college transcripts, immunization records, and job reference letters.
- Q. How long is the course?
- A. 18 months, the course starts in the spring (January) and ends the following year in the summer (June).
- Q. Is financial aid available?
- A. Yes, financial aid is available and you may obtain information from the Student Services Department.
- Q. How many people are accepted into the program?
- A. The program accepts 48 students.
- Q. How is the selection for each class determined?
- A. You must have a CNA certification before entering the LPN program. The process is based on a scoring system, which includes scores from the Accuplacer tests and an interview with the Director of Nursing.
- Q. When and where is the Accuplacer test given?
- A. The test is administered in the Financial Aid Office. The cost of the Accuplacer test is \$10. No appointment is needed, but it is given on a first come first serve basis. You may test M-F from 730- 11 a.m
- Q. How will I know if I am accepted into the program that I chose?
- A. You will be notified by mail.
- Q. If I am not selected, do I need to reapply?
- A. Yes, you will need to reapply and complete another application along with work references or personal references.
