The trail driving era of delivering Texas longhorns to the north was short-lived---less than a lifetime. After the Civil War, four major cattle trails were used, three of which passed through Kansas. The Great Western Cattle Trail was the last of these four, but it lasted longer, went a further distance, and carried more cattle than all three of its predecessors put together, over six million longhorns.

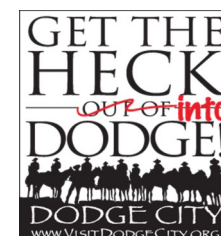
