Biography

A faithfully kind and loving husband, father, and grandpa - Herbert Roggenbuck, age 71 of Bad Axe, went to be with the Lord on Monday, September 25, 2023. He was born December 15, 1951 in Harbor Beach, son of the late Jerome and Dorothy (Messing) Roggenbuck. He married Joann Kiehl on June 7, 1980. Herb was blessed to work on the family farm with his father until he passed; and his brothers for as long as he was able to. Between work and home, he honed the principles of fortitude and fidelity - teaching his children that simply showing up and being present are more important to loved ones than being the most eloquent speaker or talented craftsman.
