A Message from Pastor Robert.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

I have been asked the question many times since I became a pastor, "If Jesus hated money so much, why does the church always ask for money?"

The question is derived from passages such as this: "No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money." Matthew 6:24

While it is my hope that most churches try to uphold this teaching, it does not change the fact that we live in a society where money is required in order to thrive. In several European countries one's church tithe (aka giving) is taken directly out of their paycheck as part of their taxes as long as that individual has declared him or herself as a Lutheran, Catholic, Baptist, Anglican, etc... this is not so in the US, therefore we must rely upon the voluntary giving of our individual members. This results in churches often being criticized for talking about money too much or not enough in their attempts to grow and gain some measure of success in spreading the Gospel.

If we wish to serve the communities that surround us by spreading the Gospel through word and deed then we need people to proclaim it, and we need the tools to support them. These tools come in many shapes and sizes, and unfortunately not too many of them are free. One of the tools we have in this community is our building and as the vast majority of you know we are in the midst of a massive building project with the hope that in the end it will be as functional and as inviting as possible so that we can not only serve our community here at Burke but also open ourselves to new ways in which we can serve the growing communities around us. The excitement within our community has been palpable as construction continues to move along and we watch as our new home is quickly coming together. Thank you everyone for all your contributions toward making this long gestating dream a reality.

Meanwhile...Our general giving is down straining our ability to spend money on our various ongoing ministry opportunities. We are not in a critical situation where programs need to be cut, but we are having to be extra careful about where our funds are going. Along with this we have also encountered several added expenses regarding the building project straining our budget even further (more on that later this month, please join us after worship on November 17th). Thankfully several individuals and groups from within our congregation have come forward and donated money and materials to help offset expenses for the building project, various activities, and ongoing programs. This has helped tremendously in keeping our spending down and preventing our budget from going over in several areas. Unfortunately if we are unable to get any new pledges for our building fund soon we will have to borrow more money than we had initially hoped.

Despite losing some beloved members this past year, due to some moving away and others succumbing to illness, attendance has remained steady and we still welcome visitors nearly every week. This tells me that we are still part of a vibrant, growing, and evolving community that has a bright future ahead. Yet as we look ahead and get excited about the new ministry opportunities that are presented by our new building let us not forget about today, and the ministry that we are doing now. So as we enter into that time of year when we look at stewardship please take some time and discern in what ways you are able to continue supporting the ministries of Burke, and what ways you may wish to grow in that support either with your time or financially.
