Dear Church Family and Friends,

The word, "Spring" is starting to creep into the vocabulary of newscasters and people just getting tired of the winter. I will plant my seedlings for my garden this week and hope for some tomatoes to be ready when our weather is finally warm enough to plant them. I am not much of a gardener and it usually turns from a garden of hope to a hopeless weed patch. I like to think that I just don't have

the gene for a green thumb, but my grandfather and grandmother were master gardeners. The problem is not genetic but commitment. I enjoy getting my tiller out and digging up the garden and planting it, but I tend to get busy, lose interested and don't take daily care of my garden until it is just too late. The weeds win out! It is



crucial to take the time to water, weed and feed the plants until is time to take out the garden in the late fall. I can't just plant and pray that everything grows right.



A garden is a lot like faith. Seed are planted in lots of ways. Children come to church with parents/grandparents, a conversation with a friend, a tragedy that caused someone to look for faith or many other ways. It is crucial that people step forward to help these children to be part of our church today. We need people who will to be willing to take a turn in the nursery. Young families need the support of the church



family. There will be many opportunities to help our babies, children and youth. Also, we need to be watching for young Christians – those new to the faith.

Can we be a church full of gardeners? During the mini mission trip, I had time to have some really good conversation with the teens. They have much on their minds. They are seedlings, trying to find their way in the world.

As we enter the season of Lent, it is great time to pray about how God is calling us to be gardeners. Let's give good spiritual soil, water and food so God can grow and amazing garden in our midst.

# Monitor and Adjust, Report on the Niagara Falls Mission Trip

The title words have been the theme of many a mission trip. RUPC took a group of 8 to the Niagara Fall Community Mission on February 19. The weather tried to keep us out by sending predictions of freezing rain, so we waited a day. This became a one-day trip instead of two, but what a great trip. 5 middle school youth and 3 adults awoke to one of the coldest days of the season, -4, burrrr! With a prayer, we were off at 7:20 am, when it was just getting light!





We arrived at 9:00 am and were greeted by Rev. Mark Breese, the spiritual director who gave us a brief history

and scope of the mission which was started in the 1920's after a Crusade by Billy Sunday. The mission has many facets and is in the 95% of the largest mission of this type. There are 140 full time employees! The outreach consists of a food pantry, a soup kitchen - open 6 days a week, a clothing and furniture closet and a homeless shelter. This shelter is not the typical over night shelter, but one that works with helping people in every way to get their own permanent shelter. There primary focus is on those dealing with mental illness and those released from prison. They work with

many other agencies to help the whole person and family. This is an ecumenical ministry and spiritual services and counseling are offered to anyone who want it, but is not a requirement. No one is turned away for religious reasons.

Our team was divided into two groups. Tracy Carlson, Anna Carlson, Tyler Welch and James Ashdown were on the kitchen team. They helped prepare and serve the meal for the soup kitchen. James also helped unload a truck, deliver food to a food pantry and was "promoted?!?!" to the dish room. They served 94 meals.



The other group became the "Master Trashers." Pastor Molly, Garret Carlson, Jacob Clark and Alex Hudson worked with the clothing closet, toting items that were

donated but not usable to the outside dumpsters. Dumping, crashing, and smashing became the theme of the day. Although it was cold, this team filled two dumpsters and part of a large truck. A big help to the people sorting all the donations.

Everyone joined together for lunch in the soup

kitchen. The youth commented on how good the lunch was, pizza, four bean salad, green salad, pie or cupcakes and drink. They wished that their school lunches were that good. After lunch the work projects were finished and the team was thanked by the director, Grant Babcock.

Everyone was tired but there was still energy to take a very cold sight seeing trip to view Niagara Falls. The day ended with a nice warm dinner at the Hard Rock Café. Thanks to everyone for donating time and energy to helping others!
