August 16th- PLEASE LOOK AFTER MOM by Kyung-Sook Shin (An international best seller which penetrates the very essence of what it means to be a family) This is the story of a family splintered by the loss of matriarch Sonyo, an illiterate farm wife who vanishes in a packed Seoul subway station. The novel unspools from the viewpoints of her eldest daughter, her eldest son, her abusive husband, and, finally, Shin herself. The picture that emerges shows an unappreciated mother who sacrificed her life for her family. Shin's novel probes the emotional investment and selflessness of a woman who gives so much of herself that she's nearly obliterated. PLEASE LOOK AFTER MOM is the story of South Korea's sometimes painful transition from an agrarian, war-torn nation to an economic powerhouse. The novel distills its missing central character down to a series of warm, sometimes heart-wrenching vignettes, coloured by the guilt of the shifting narrators.

About the Author Kyung-sook Shin is the author of numerous works of fiction and is one of South Korea's most widely read and acclaimed novelists. She has been honored with many prestigious awards. PLEASE LOOK AFTER MOM is her first book to appear in English and will be published in nineteen countries. Currently a visiting scholar at Columbia University in New York City, she lives in Seoul.

Ronnie Telzer visits Nashville, TN and the Country Music Festival

If you've ever wanted to meet the legends of country music, along with the latest rising stars, Nashville in June is the place to be. I attended my first CMA Music Festival June 9-12 in Nashville, Tennessee with my husband, Greg, and daughter, Lynn. They are both huge country music fans while I have always had a passion for New York and Broadway (although I did meet and interview rock star Jimi Hendrix for my school newspaper when I was 16).



For me, the best part of the Nashville music event was actually having the opportunity to meet a few Broadway stars who are also making a mark on the country scene. Four-day passholders are welcome to attend the air-conditioned Fan Fair at the Nashville Convention Center. We met Laura Bell Bundy (who starred in Legally Blonde on Broadway) and Kristin Chenoweth (who starred in Wicked and Promises, Promises). Lynn also met Charlie Daniels (who has his own museum in downtown Nashville), Josh Gracin (from American Idol) and Lynn Anderson ("I Never Promised You a Rose Garden.")

We purchased four-day passes for the event and attended nightly four-hour concerts at the LP Field. Warning: this is a huge outdoor stadium that often stays hot in the evening. We saw nearly everyone who is big in country music--Keith Urban, Lady Antebellum, Brad Paisley, Blake Shelton, Taylor Swift, Martina McBride, and Sugarland. Four-day passes for the 2012 event (June 7-10) go on sale July 30, 2011. (For information, check out CMAFest.com or Ticketmaster.com.) They sell out fast but can also be purchased in hotel/tour packages. It's fun to sit in the same seats and see the same people every night! If you go, bring a fan!

We booked our own hotel--The Drury Inn & Suites near the airport (which was recommended by a midwestern friend) and conveniently located about 15 minutes from downtown. The Drury offers a nightly reception with free food and beverages. We also explored the Nashville area. I took a Gray Line tour of country star homes and visited the outlet mall in suburban Franklin. Greg saw the reproduction of the Parthenon and tried some local food specialties like "hot chicken." Lynn checked out the free daytime concerts, won some DVD's at the ABC Summer Block Party booth, and bought some cowboy boots at one of the many country and western stores on Broadway. We all had a great time, and even managed to stop at the Jack Daniel's Distillery in Lynchburg, TN on the way home.
