#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE (continued)

As we approach the month of October, all Subordinate Granges should consider sending delegates to the annual State Session beginning on Friday morning October 15 and concluding on Sunday, October 17. Registration for the session should be post-marked by September 15. A Registration Form was printed in the May/June PA Grange News magazine on page 21. A \$10 late fee will be charged for any postmarked registration received after the deadline date.

This event will be held in the King of Prussia area at the Valley Forge Casino Resort. The following information will help your delegates get ready for this annual session in making reservations for nights of October 14, 15 and 16.

Host Hotel - Valley Forge Casino Resort, 1160 First Avenue, King of Prussia, PA 19406. The <u>room rate at the Valley is \$126.00 per night, plus tax (king/double).</u> <u>Book your room directly with the</u> <u>hotel to ensure you get the Grange's group rate and that the host region gets credit for their contracted room</u> <u>commitment.</u> Book by calling the hotel directly at (610)354-8118 - mention Group Block Code: A1021GR -PA State Grange and request rooms in the Valley Tower. Please indicate your room preference (king, double), the number guests per room, and supply your contact information (First and last name, Address, Phone number, E-mail (if applicable) and a credit card to hold the reservation. A deposit of the first night's room fee + taxes will be charged to your card when booking, but it is refundable if you cancel at least 3 days prior to your arrival date.

<u>Reservations for rooms should be made prior to September 22 using the Grange Block code</u>. Securing your room prior to September 22<sup>nd</sup> is a cost savings for you since the cost will be increased on September 23. It is best to take advantage of the special rate for Grangers going to the convention. **PLEASE NOTE:** Going through another source to book your room will not be an advantage to the hosting committee since there is a guarantee of having 100 rooms utilized during the conference. **PLEASE** book directly through the hotel.

#### September BBQ

The Berks County Grange is doing a Chicken BBQ on Sunday, September 5 at Leesport Farmer's Market from 11am-2pm, this is Labor Day weekend. The meal will consist of a half chicken, baked potato, roll, applesauce, and a bottle of water. The chicken will be done on an open-pit charcoal grill done by Two Guys Chicken. Each meal will cost \$10 (\$11 the day of the sale). The Family Activities committee is planning to hold a bake sale.

We are asking Grange members to sell tickets and we are offering the incentive of 1 free ticket for every 15 tickets sold. We know that it may be hard for members to sell tickets, because of the distance to Leesport. We are suggesting that you sell tickets, pick up the dinners, and then set up a time and location closer to your customers.

#### FUND-RAISER with OLEY FAIR

As we all know, the Berks County Pomona Grange eliminated the Pomona Sale and now needs to find ways to fund our projects for Community Service concerns as well as keep up with our regular expenses throughout the year.

The Oley Fair Board has approached Berks County Pomona to help with one of the stands during their fair on September 16, 17 and 18, 2021. A committee met with the Board members and felt our Pomona could provide staff to man the SOUP STAND (Vegetable and Chicken Noodle) during the fair.

What does the County Grange get out of this? We will receive monetary contribution from the Oley Fair. In 2019 when we helped, the Grange received \$900 for our treasury and even though we did not help in 2020 (due to the Covid-19 issue) the Oley Fair was kind enough to provide us with another \$900 contribution to our organization (this is what the Oley Fair does; spreads it funding to other organizations).

There will be a coordination of scheduling of volunteers from all our Subordinate Granges in order to accomplish this task. Henry



Seidel, Michael Adams, Fern Kulp and Nettie Kauffman will oversee this project. This committee is seeking HELP from each of you in order to properly run the soup stand during the fair. A time frame to help would be possibly 2 to 2-1/2 hour shifts each day of the fair and only so many volunteers can be accommodated on each shift. Beginning at 9 AM to 10 - 10:30 at night volunteers will be needed. If more volunteers sign up for a specific shift, they can be used elsewhere at the fair. The more volunteers helping (either in Soup Stand or elsewhere) will provide more sources of income for our organization. Anyone who helps will receive a car pass to get into the fair; pass will be kept and good for any additional time one volunteers.

All non-vaccinated staff and residents are tested once a week. Scheduled visits which are limited to 30 minutes resumed after the testing. As the number of positive cases decline, they are slowly relaxing the restrictions.
