### First Quarter 2020 Report to the Members of System Council 16 – IBEW

Dear Members,

I will start by saying that my tenure as General Chairman started with a bang. As Mark Klecka began his transition into retirement, I took over with National Negotiations starting up, current bargaining on three independent railroads in progress and Section 6 Notices coming due on a fourth. In March, COVID-19 struck and all the above came to a sudden halt. The virus has consumed much of our time as we try to stay abreast of the everchanging policies of the Carriers as directed by the CDC so we can answer Member's questions. As you will read, much of this report will be directly attributed to COVID-19.

#### **National Negotiations:**

The first round was held in Washington DC on February 26-27, 2020. This meeting was mostly formalities and presentations with no offers or proposals. Later meetings up to this writing have been cancelled and future meetings are in limbo due to travel and gathering restrictions due to COVID-19.

#### **Paducah and Louisville:**

I'm sad to inform you that the P&L furloughed 50% of it's workforce this month. This included 3 of our Brothers.

#### **Canadian Pacific:**

Jeff Burk, Charles Kretchman and I attended the second round of bargaining in Minneapolis on March 10, 2020. The CP was to be prepared to make a proposal but due to the sharp decline in their stock prices on the previous day, were unable to offer anything. All future negotiations are on hold due to COVID-19.

## **NICTD:**

There have been no changes in negotiations. NICTD, a passenger rail, has realized a greater than 90% drop in passengers due to COVID-19

## **BELT:**

According to a recent conference call, traffic volumes are good, and COVID-19 has had little effect on the Property.

## **BNSF:**

As of April 1, 2020, 28 members have been impacted directly by COVID-19 through symptoms or quarantine. BNSF is the only property that has reported craft specific impacts. Business has continued to decline and as of April 15, 2020 BNSF has placed 48,000 freight cars in storage status. On a good note, Mechanical is cancelling some of the locomotive work that it contracted out and is moving this work back to the shops.

## **CN:**

At many locations, CN is taking employees temperatures and asking health questions prior to allowing them on property. As CN typically operates, the process was put in place before any information was put out to the membership.

## **LS&I:**

Section Six Notices were served on April 1, 2020. The conference was waived and we agreed to schedule negotiations after travel restrictions due to COVID-19 are lifted.

## **GARY:**

There have been some informal contract negotiations which haven't resulted in anything. They seem to revolve around an interim general wage increase until National Negotiations are settled, then moving to direct negotiations.

## **MRL:**

No news to report.

## **Evansville and Western:**

No news to report.

## **Railroad Retirement Board:**

Recently, we sent out communications concerning COVID-19 and unemployment/sickness benefits. As you are aware, the recently passed CARE Act granted railroad employees an additional \$1,200 pay increase, per pay half, if you are unemployed. According to the RRB, this only applies if you are furloughed. Anyone being quarantined for possible contact or experiencing symptoms will be placed on sick benefits.

The one week waiting period for unemployment and sickness has been waived.

## **National Health and Welfare:**

The deadline for the Spouse Audit has been extended until June 30, 2020. There are still members who haven't responded or submitted incorrect documentation. We have sent out ample correspondence about this and it is imperative that our members comply.

I hope that you all stay safe and healthy through all of this and I look forward to getting out and visiting with the Membership after all this is over. It is an honor to serve as your General Chairman.

### Second Quarter 2020 Report to the Members of System Council 16

Dear Members,

I will start this report with the small amount of good news that I have to share with you; we are getting regular reports that freight volumes are beginning to steadily increase. The volumes are nowhere near where they need to be at, and many locomotives remain in storage.

As of June 30, 2020, Mark Klecka is officially retired. Mark is an awesome union representative, mentor, and friend. We all wish him a long, healthy, and prosperous retirement. Mark had well over 40 years of railroad service, nearly 20 of those were on the Council.

Much remains unchanged since my last report except for BNSF. BNSF has furloughed nearly 200 IBEW Members. Some of the furloughs are short term until business resumes, others are permanent due to a decline in coal traffic. BNSF closed its' Mechanical Facilities in Guernsey, WY and Glendive, MT.

National Negotiations remain at a standstill. There have been no negotiations since the first session back in February due to COVID-19. All negotiations on roads that are not covered by national handling are on hold as well for the same reason.

COVID-19 is continuing to wreak havoc. Our Members have been affected at nearly every Carrier by either testing positive or quarantining due to exposure.

If you know of Members who are on medical leave for illness, injury, or quarantine, please remind them to apply for their supplemental sickness benefits through The Hartford (formerly Aetna) after applying for RRB benefits. Recently, we were surprised to learn that some Members were not aware of this and missed applying for the benefit.

I realize this is a short report, but not much has changed since the end of the first quarter except for what is noted above. I sincerely hope that the next report contains better news.

I hope each of you stays safe and healthy.

### Third Quarter 2020 Report to the Members of System Council 16

Dear Members,

The third quarter of 2020 continued to see an increase in demand for the freight railroads. The larger roads have began removing locomotives from storage and recalling some furloughed members. We are hearing that they may be hiring at some locations. We will continue to work with the Carriers to see that furloughed members get an opportunity to transfer to the locations before they hire off the street. Commuter properties continue to suffer a devastating impact due to the pandemic.

National Negotiations are back in session via video conference. The Carriers and our Coalition met on July 28<sup>th</sup> and October 1<sup>st</sup>. There hasn't been any progress to report as both sides seem to be waiting for the results of the election next month.

We participated in the first round of bargaining with the Evansville and Western on September 17<sup>th</sup>. The Carrier's offer to our members was insulting to say the least and there are currently no more bargaining sessions scheduled at this time.

Negotiations on other properties, not in National, are not progressing as the parties wait to see what happens in National Negotiations.

COVID-19 continues to wreak havoc on all properties, with continued reports of quarantine due to positive test results and possible contact. Information from the weekly COVID calls, by many of the Carriers, suggests that the numbers are accelerating.

Due to COVID, System Council 16 has realized a savings due to our inability to travel. In order to utilize this savings in the best interest of our membership, the Executive Board has unanimously approved holding an officer training workshop in 2021. The workshop is planned for the first part of June 2021 and more information will be sent to the locals with exact details closer to the date.

In other news, Wabtec/GE is planning pilot testing of an all battery powered locomotive between Barstow and Stockton California on the BNSF. The pilot is scheduled to last for 90 days and should commence in the near future. This technology could be an asset for the IBEW in the future.

I hope everyone had safe and enjoyable Holidays. As of this writing, 2020 is gone and 2021 isn't starting off much better. As with most 4<sup>th</sup> quarters, there is not much new to report.

There is nothing new to report on National Negotiations, I would think that bargaining would start back up soon.

We are pleased to announce that IBEW Local 2355 has ratified a 5-year contract with the Northern Indiana Commuter Transportation District (NICTD).

Negotiations are continuing on the Evansville and Western Railroad with another round of bargaining scheduled for next week. The other Roads remain at an impasse waiting to see what happens in National Bargaining.

COVID-19 continues to affect the Membership on nearly every property represented by this Council. Due to the continued high number of infections and the slower than anticipated roll out of the vaccine, we will more than likely push our planned officer training into 2022 out of an abundance of caution for the attendees. We will continue to assess the situation up until the deadline to pull our contract with the hotel.

If your Local intends to send delegates to the International Convention in Chicago this fall, it is important to stay current on per capita throughout the year.

We are seeing an increase in discipline for people not accurately reporting time. If you are responsible for entering your own time for payroll, please double check it for accuracy. These incidents usually end up with charges of dishonesty, with very serious consequences.

As business ramps up after the Holidays, I am sure there will be much more to report in the first quarter of 2021. Until then, I would like to wish everyone a happy, safe, and prosperous New Year.
