

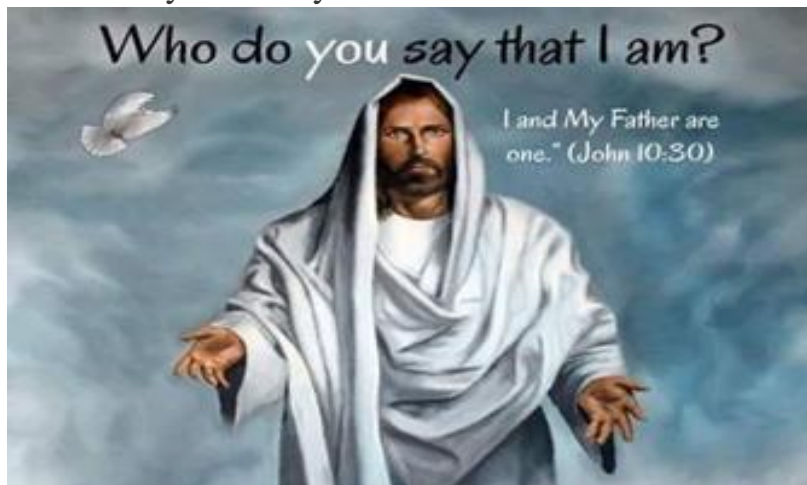

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

21st Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

Matthew 16:13-20

"Who am I to you?" Such a question can be a scary proposition because of the 'defining' moment that follows as we open our hearts to share our feelings to another person, letting them know how we feel about them and how we see them! It can be similar to that awkward moment of silence that makes good drama in movies, when a close friend has stronger feelings than just a simple friendship, and he/she expresses an intimate, "I love you" to that other person. After vulnerably sharing how they feel, the overture basically asks the other person to reciprocate or at least 'define' how they feel back toward them. Maybe the relationship goes forward and all is well, or it may fall completely apart, because the new level of feeling is not mutual (or it's confusingly ambiguous!) But certainly, the relationship won't remain the same! I see Jesus taking such a step in today's gospel as He risks asking His apostles to let Him know what He means to them ("who do YOU say that I am"). It takes a strong self-concept (a person's comfort with themselves) and deep trust to expose one's heart to another like Jesus does to His apostles, asking them to tell him honestly and straight what He means to them. Have you ever solicited constructive criticism from another person, or a critical evaluation from someone else about yourself? It is a risk, not only for the possible hurt feelings we may receive, if their perception doesn't match our own perception of ourselves, but it could also rupture the relationship, sending the person away if it's not handled well. Imagine, what if the apostles were silent and had nothing to say in return to Jesus? Thanks be to God that Peter was perceptive enough and in touch with Jesus, to remark, **"You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God"** (Matt 16:16). But, what if Peter had only said, "Oh, Jesus, you are one of boyz!" Again, such personal questions, as **"What do I mean to you?"** are major **'defining moments'** in a relationship. If the honest sharing of feelings isn't received well on either side, it can set the relationship back in a big way, or even end it all together. We will see such a set-back in John 14:8-9, right after Jesus' apostle Philip asks Jesus, "Show us the Father". There, Jesus seems to respond with a deflated 'let-down' voice, saying back, *"Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'?"* Ouch! Philip and Jesus now have some 'relationship work' to do to restore a sense of trust and friendship again. It happens most famously with Peter, too, later on when Peter will arrogantly boast that he would lay down his life for Jesus and Jesus gently responds back, *"Will you lay down your life for me? Amen, amen, I say to you Peter, the cock will not crow before you deny me three times"* (John 13:38). Of course, Jesus will initiate the 'relationship healing' and He specifically does at the Last Supper, when **Jesus says to His apostles that He is praying for them** and that He does everything out of love for them. In John 16:1, Jesus tells them, "I speak like this, so that you may not fall away", and in John 17:15, Jesus prays to the Father, "I do not ask that you take them out of the world but that you keep them from the evil one." And in John 17:26, Jesus reveals to us that the motivation for preserving and deepening relationship to us is that we know Him fully, and know His Love of us when He prays, "Father, I made known to them your name and I will make it known, that the love with which you loved me may be in them." But such trust of us and the sharing of a person's s deepest feelings is an emotional risk

So, Jesus gives to us in this episode of personal encounter between Him and the apostles, a wonderful example of how a Christian leader can be both vulnerable and strong at the same time. Love demands honesty, but such truth in relationships may be hard to bear, too. But such interpersonal trust and sharing alone is what leads to true & lasting relationships. Jesus models for us 'human vulnerability' and 'relationship-building' trust, by asking us the question **"Who do you say I am?"** Each of us have an answer in to response to His question. What do we say? Who is Jesus to us?

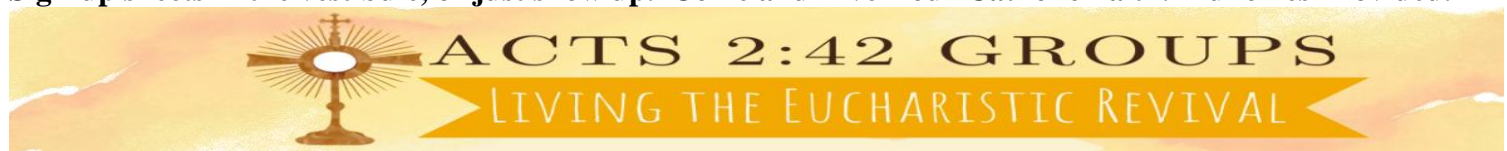
