

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

MAKING ALL THINGS NEW-UPDATE

Our Parish Core Team for Making All Things New has been busy meeting and correlating the results of the parish survey, communicating them to the Archdiocesan Team, attending cluster meetings and preparing for the remaining part of the exercise. Our last two meetings were held at Sacred Heart parish. The finalized cluster arrangement has been communicated to us. St. Bartholomew's will cluster (work and share) with four other parishes: Sacred Heart, Christ the King, Most Holy Trinity, and St. Anthony.

At one of our meetings each parish shared what they considered their strengths. **Christ the King** spoke of their vibrant worshipping community and their well-kept facilities. **Most Holy Trinity** mentioned that they had a beautiful church, with a refurbished pipe organ and an outstanding choir. The team from **St. Anthony's** spoke about their liturgical and sacramental life and their financial stability. Sacred Heart representatives spoke about their well executed liturgies, their cultural plurality and large parish campus. The Core Team from St. Bartholomew's spoke about our plurality, our caring, dedicated, supportive priests from the Missionary Society of Saint Paul, and our enriching and viable Religious Education program. Each parish mentioned that they are a warm and welcoming community.

In terms of areas to work on, the parishes collectively acknowledged the need to increase efforts in the areas of evangelization and outreach to inactive Catholics, young adults and the youth. Fact sheets on parish finances and statistics were exchanged. Comparatively, St. Bartholomew's is in very good standing.

Thanks a lot for being a part of our parish family. Thanks for all you do to make St. Bart's what it is today. Thanks in advance for all you will still do to help us fulfill the mission entrusted to us as a parish.
