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Musings in the 'Hood

At the June Board meeting, I heard that canvassers were in our 'hood knocking on doors, asking neighbors to sign a petition to get an issue allowing cannabis stores in S. Lyon on an upcoming ballot. And if you didn't read about it in the minutes posted in the July newsletter, the discussion piqued my interest. Evidently, some neighbors welcomed the canvassers and signed the petition. It was reported that others even invited them into their homes.

And that got me thinking....why do some neighbors ignore, or don't know about, our "no solicitation" policy? I can clearly see the "no soliciting" sign near the entrance off 11 Mile Road. Maybe you've seen it, maybe you haven't. I've had window installers knock on my door in the past. I typically ask if they have a permit to solicit here and then tell them they aren't allowed to solicit here.

I'm always concerned that anyone knocking on my door to tell me I need new windows or other services might also be casing out my unit. And I'm very concerned for my neighbors who may have a hard time getting to the door or may be frightened by a stranger asking questions.

Canvassers asking to sign a petition sounds like a different matter. They aren't selling anything, right? Well, actually, they are still soliciting, just like if Girl Scouts selling cookies, or Boy Scouts selling popcorn. It's just not allowed here.

Maybe you didn't know we have a "no soliciting" sign. Perhaps you didn't think this was soliciting. Either way, the bottom line is that we are all part of a community and have a whole bunch of rules to honor. One of them is "no soliciting." Others include not feeding wildlife and not putting out advertising, lawn sale or political signs without written permission from the Board of Directors.

If we each lived in a private home on our own property, we could probably welcome solicitors. And we probably could put political signs and garage sale signs out, as well, as long as it falls within the restrictions of the community we lived in.

But everyone here chose to live in a coop community. We have number of rules that we should honor by following them, whether we agree with them or not. That's my two cents. Where do you stand on this?




Discussions were held regarding placement of stone around clubhouse for weed control. Referred to the Board as this is not a clubhouse committee responsibility.


Any ideas for an activity at the Clubhouse should be brought to the Clubhouse committee. Chairpersons are also needed for activities.



Paul's Corner: Outside Spigots

Whether you use your outdoor spigot every day, or only on rare occasions, proper maintenance will extend its lifespan. Also commonly called a hose bib, sillcock*, or outdoor faucet, each unit in phase five is equipped with two: one in the courtyard, and one in the back. Each unit is responsible for their own spigots; they are not covered by the Colonial Acres Co-op.

Original hose bibs, as well as ones replaced by Paul's Plumbing, are Frost Free Sillcocks. This style has a longer stem that extends into the basements. They offer freeze protection. What this means, is that as long as you have removed your hose from the spigot, your sillcock should not freeze and break during the winter.

You read that correctly. All you have to do to winterize your outdoor faucets, is to remove your hoses. There is no need to turn off the water supply in your basements, or use foam covers.

The rule of thumb:

Memorial Day - Put your hoses on.

Labor Day - Take hoses off after each use.

Halloween - Put your hose away for the year.

If you cannot get your hose off, please give Paul's Plumbing a call at 248-437-0501. This service is not covered by the co-op, and would be at a charge to the resident, but we can take a look at it and see what needs to be done.

The most common cause for stubborn hoses, is that the metal has seized onto the threads of the spigot. This usually happens because the fitting of the hose is a metal dissimilar to the spigot. We recommend being sure to always use hoses with brass fittings. Do NOT use "copper infused", aluminum, or steel. These metals will eventually corrode and seize, making it difficult or even impossible to remove the hose. To check if your hose is proper brass, rather than brass painted, scrape the side with a knife.

We also encourage all residents to NOT use expandable hoses. These types of hoses put too much stress on the anti-siphoning device and will eventually lead to its failure.

Sometimes, even with winterizing, spigots can fail. When first using your outdoor faucet for the year, be sure to keep an eye out for leaks. If there are any problems, turn the spigot back off. Although service is not covered by the co-op, and would be at a charge to the resident, Paul's Plumbing can be contacted at 248-437-0501 for any repairs.

*See definition of a Sillcock from Merriam-Webster Dictionary:

Sillcock - A water faucet placed at about sill height on the outside of a building, extending to the interior of the building offering freeze protection, and usually threaded for attaching a hose.




