

Followers or Disciples?

From time to time, we need to stop and consider the depth of the decision we have made to be a follower of Jesus. So easily we can expect our Christian life to be undisturbed and unchallenged Occasionally we are given a nudge to stop and consider the deeper impact of what it means to be a "disciple" – not just a "follower" - of Jesus. Our awareness may be suddenly jolted by a media vision of medical personnel from the international community who have left family, peace and security to their lives to bring relief to thousands of men, women and children who are displaced through famine and civil war and live in fear for their lives. The medical personnel are about embedding a culture of welcome and healing in the world in which they work.

In Jesus' mission some would have been attracted by his gifts of healing but put off by his frank teaching about the challenges of Gospel living. Words about forsaking all, including possessions and family to follow him, would have brought their enthusiasm to a halt. But Jesus is not reminding those who are listening that we should have no love for those closest to us, but that faithfulness to the Gospel challenges complacency and will take us beyond our comfort zones for the greater good of embedding Gospel values into the lives of others.


Closer to home as we progressed in age and embraced the responsibilities of nurturing and sharing a family, a faith or supportive school community, we would become aware of the sacrifice, hard work and selflessness of those who had gone before to put the wellbeing and safety of all first even if it was not appreciated at the time. And in our childhood days how often might we have heard mum or dad say, 'Be respectful to grown-ups', but also,' Never speak to or accept gifts from strangers'? Then again looking back as adults we came to realise that when mum or dad had said a definite "No" to us, that "No" replaced a "Yes" for the sake of a quiet life for them to ensure our greater safety, wellbeing and healthier social development. All this so we might become active members of a society that shared a culture of looking out for the safety and rights of others. In other words, "Loving our neighbours as ourselves."

Jesus revealed to us the image of God as 'Abba' -one of the first utterances a growing infant makes. "Abba" a doting loving Father, teaching his child to walk, 'holding his hand and leading him through difficult paths, running out to tearfully welcome home a long lost son. This is Jesus' model of God and of Discipleship. May we be open to this mind and heart of Christ Jesus no matter what challenges we face.

And may we strive to build a safe and Supporting Community where Children, Young and Vulnerable people are respected and Supported



## **Serving at Sacred Heart**

Sacred Heart holds the care, safety and wellbeing of children, youth and vulnerable adults as a fundamental responsibility of the Church.

Our common commitment is drawn from the teaching and mission of Jesus with love and Justice and the dignity and sanctity of each human person at the heart of the Gospel. It is the policy of the Archdiocese that all clergy, employees and volunteers over the age of 18 must maintain current Working with Children Check (WWCC) throughout their involvement in parishes as in other agencies: all are to attend a safeguarding essentials module and updates organised by the Parish or Professional Standards online: and all are asked to sign a Declaration to abide by the parish Code of Conduct. These requirements of volunteers are just one -but an essential part of our united commitment to creating and maintaining a culturally safe environment for the young and the vulnerable in which they feel safe, heard and respected.



Fr Rob Galea and two female co-hosts (Alyssa Agius & Justine Cumbo) study the weekly readings and break them down into layman's terms, showing you how they are relevant to our life today. They make theology accessible for the everyday person - think of it as a conversation with friends complete with all the tears, laughter and joy, but with the opportunity to learn something new each week. Whether you have been Catholic all your life, you are new to the faith, or outside of the faith, there is something for everyone!

## POINT NUMBER 4: Four key principles for biodiversity

Francis also uses his message to call on nations to halt the further collapse of the "web of life" – biodiversity – pointing to four principles:

- 1. Building a clear ethical basis for the transformation we need to save biodiversity.
- 2. Fight biodiversity loss, support its conservation and recovery, and meet people's needs in a sustainable way.
- 3. Promote global solidarity, considering that biodiversity is a global common good that requires a shared commitment.
- 4. Put people in vulnerable situations at the centre, including those most affected by biodiversity loss, such as indigenous peoples, older people, and youth.

## 52 Ways to help the environment (cont'd) 43. Have fun without flying

Think about how to travel on vacation with friends and family in a more sustainable way. You might travel together by train instead of by plane or cruise ship. Travel slowly, discovering the closeness and wisdom of each other and others.

## 44. Innovate while practicing sustainable fashion

Create our own handmade clothes, asking others to teach you or watching YouTube videos about how to knit. Start or join a group with your friends to exchange used clothes. Encourage parish flea markets of clothes, furniture, and household items. In cold weather, do not turn the heating up too high if you can wear warm clothes.

### **SECOND READING**

I am sending him back to you, and with him - I could say - a part of my own self. I should have liked to keep him with me; he could have been a substitute for you, to help me while I am in the chains that the Good News has brought me. However, I did not want to do anything without your consent; it would have been forcing your act of kindness, which should be spontaneous. I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you could have him back for ever, not as a slave any more, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother; especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a bloodbrother as well as a brother in the Lord. So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.

#### **GOSPEL**

Luke 14:25-33

Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way and he turned and spoke to them. 'If any man comes to me without hating his father, mother, wife, children, brothers, sisters, yes and his own life

too, he cannot be my disciple. Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

'And indeed, which of you here, intending to build a tower, would not first sit down and work out the cost to see if he had enough to complete it? Otherwise, if he laid the foundation and then found himself unable to finish the work, the onlookers would all start making fun of him and saying, "Here is a man who started to build and was unable to finish." Or again, what king marching to war against another king would not first sit down and consider whether with ten thousand men he could stand up to the other who advanced against him with twenty thousand? If not, then while the other king was still a long way off, he would send envoys to sue for peace. So in the same way, none of you can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions.'
