I took my family to a Family Camp on Catalina Island this summer. We spent the week at a Christian camp called Campus By the Sea. We swam in the ocean, played on the playgrounds, slept in fun cabins—even enjoyed the lack of cell phone service!

We all get busy, always rushing out of our house, only to return home exhausted and ready to relax.

We all want to do our own things, and live our own schedules, even within the same house. To come together, even for a few moments, and talk with God seems impossible to some of us!

Psalm 1:1-2 Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers, but whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and who meditates on his law day and night.

May I encourage you to struggle a little, fight through exhaustion

and a busy schedule, and find time in your house to seek God, thank God, and worship God? You might find your day has a new, brighter, God-focused outlook for you and each family member!
