Batteries Oil Paint Antifreeze

There are some items in your home (e.g. cleaners, batteries, paint) that are hazardous and should never be placed in your roll cart. After they have been used, they become **Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)**. The most common types of HHW are **Batteries**, Oil, Paint and Antifreeze (BOPA).


REGISTER FOR A FREE TREE SEPT. 5 - SEPT. 30, 2023

The City of Dallas is proud to announce its fifth annual Branch Out Dallas program to provide residents with a **FREE 5-gallon tree**. Trees benefit the urban environment by reducing stormwater runoff to drainage systems, cooling temperatures, improving air quality and mitigating the heat island effect. Residents can register at dallas.gov/branchoutdallas from Sept. 5 to Sept. 30, while supplies last.

Residents will be able to choose from five types of Texas trees and six pick-up locations throughout Dallas. Residents who register for a free tree may collect it on Saturday, Nov. 4, 2023, from 9 a.m. to noon.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS AND RESTRICTIONS:

- Must live within the Dallas city limits
- Must present a City of Dallas water bill or government-issued ID to verify residency
- Only one (1) tree per residence
- ✓ Tree delivery is not available; trees must be picked up during event hours.

Second Block Party in Druid Hills History?

A block party cookout was held on Saturday, May 20th, at 6:30PM in Druid Hills. Turns out there was at least one of the same event back in the past...It sounds like both the block party cookouts held in 2023, and the one that took place back in the early '60s were great successes!

There was one such event somewhere in the early 1960's for Druid Hills. The organizers were Dr. Kenneth Collings and his wife, Marie. They were at 2020 W Five Mile Pkwy, neighbors of Pete Handley's parents at 2014. Dr. Collings was Chairman of the Periodontics Department at Baylor Dental School in Dallas, and founder of the periodontics graduate program there. He, and his wife, Marie, had a tandem bicycle, and would take rides together, making the circle of Five Mile, Cloudcroft, Siesta, Holiday, then back.

Their original plan was to make it for the folks on Five Mile Parkway, from Holiday to Cloudcroft. At that time, Five Mile ended at a white fence, adjacent to 2008 Cloudcroft. Word got around, and it was then opened up to the folks on Cloudcroft and Siesta. The City Streets Department was contacted and put temporary barriers up for the day of the event. Families had kids move backyard picnic tables out in front of the Collings home, lined up, and there was a good turnout. Lots of neighbors already knew each other, but it was a chance to meet quite a few others and have a good time.

Fast forward to 2023, the recent event was equally successful, with around 50 neighbors from the three blocks (Five Mile Parkway, Cloudcroft, and Siesta) and others from the surrounding OPENA area, up to and including Kiestwood neighbors. It was a joyful gathering with a special appearance by Mayor Pro-Tem Carolyn King Arnold, who spent time chatting with the group, but especially with the ladies.

Bill McKinney did an excellent job procuring the supplies and cooking on the grill. Cylena and Kelly Joe supplied tables, chairs and other necessities. Tom Forsyth and Bill McKinney set up canopies, tables, and music. A special thanks to Don and Susie for their electricity! Neighbors contributed by bringing sides, creating a delightful neighborhood feast.

It's heartwarming to see everyone come together for these events, fostering a sense of community and unity. The organizers encourage other neighborhoods to follow suit and set up their own local block parties, especially with the cooler weather coming up in the Fall, as it presents an excellent opportunity to bring neighbors together and celebrate the beauty of the neighborhood.
