DESCRIPTION: Great looking and performing recurve. The Palomino was Pearson's top of the line bow in the 1960s. Brazilian Rosewood riser with contrasting White Holly laminates. (Rare Brazilian Rosewood has been banned for decades now but was the riser material of choice for high-end bows back in the day). No delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. Two filled sight holes (see pic p.4). No chips, dings or cracks. No stress lines or crazing. Decal is in very good condition. A few minor scratches and scrapes here and there. This is a really nice bow in excellent condition for its age. Other than the 2 sight holes, the only other flaw is the blemish/discoloration on the side of the riser. (see p. 4). The 1966 Palomino cost \$95 new, which would translate to \$756 in 2020 inflation-adjusted dollars.
