Thank you for my hurting. — In these difficult days, do we have the faith to

embrace our pain as a gift from God?

David, a 2-year old with leukemia, was taken by his mother, Deborah, to Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, to see Dr. John Truman who specializes in treating children with cancer and various blood diseases. Dr. Truman's prognosis was devastating: "He has a 50-50 chance."

The countless clinic visits, the blood tests, the intravenous drugs, the fear and pain—the mother's ordeal can be almost as bad as the child's because she must stand by, unable to bear the pain herself.

David never cried in the waiting room, and although the staff in the clinic had to hurt him and stick needles in him, he hustled in ahead of him mother with a smile, sure of the welcome he always got.


When he was three, David had to have a spinal tap—a painful procedure at any age. It was explained to him that, because he was sick, Dr. Truman had to do something to make him better. "If it hurts, remember it's because he loves you," Deborah said. The procedure was horrendous. It took three nurses to hold David still, while he yelled and sobbed and struggled.

When it was almost over, the tiny boy, soaked in sweat and tears, looked up at the doctor and gasped, "Thank you, Dr. Tooman, for my hurting." *

Health, strength, food, clothing, family, friends, our jobs, the opportunity to save for the future... all of these are good gifts from God. But pain and struggle can also be gifts from God. Pain signals us that something in our lives needs attention. Pain moves us to act when we might otherwise do nothing. Pain drives us to our knees in prayer and reminds us of our need for God and our dependence on Him.

In the Old Testament, we read that as the Hebrew people were about to enter the Promised Land —a land flowing with milk and honey, a place of comfort and pros-



perity—God warned them that their comfortable life would lead them to neglect their relationship with God, drift away from Him, forget that they needed Him.

The same happens today. In our comfortable society, when we have the resources to meet our needs and then go off to enjoy ourselves, God gets relegated to what ever is left over of our time, attention, and priority. We can look back and see days when we were much more faithful to Him in worship, ministry, witness, and spiritual growth.

Maybe these increasingly difficult days are a gift from God. In this season of Thanksgiving, would you say, "Thank you, God, for my hurting"?

5:00 PM—Children's Craft-making and Fun Event



Future meeting times and dates will be announced as we find out when we are needed. If you have a different time or day, call 910-284-7101.






