# Mr. Richard Einhorn, Composer "Love of Music and Hearing Loss: A Personal Story"

Richard Einhorn is a composer, music producer, and hearing loss consultant. A summa cum laude graduate of Columbia University, Richard's oratorio with silent film, Voices of Light, has been called a "great masterpiece of modern music" and been performed by the National Symphony, Baltimore Symphony, and at Disney Hall, the National Cathedral of Washington, and the Sydney Opera House. It had its Disney Hall premiere in the fall of 2014. Richard's production of Yo Yo Ma's Bach Cello Suites was awarded a Grammy for Best Instrumental Performance. Richard's advocacy for better hearing technology has been featured numerous times in the New York Times, Washington Post, and on NPR.

After losing much of his hearing to a virus in June of 2010, Richard has become a nationally known advocate for better hearing assistance featured in the New York Times, the Washington Post, on NPR, and elsewhere. He has served as a consultant on the design of hearing apps for smartphones, written articles on improved hearing technology for audiology and medical magazines, and given numerous public presentations in the US and England on hearing loss. Recently elected to the board of the Hearing Loss Association of America, Richard delivered the Keynote Address at HLAA's annual convention in June, 2014.

Richard Einhorn lives in New York City with his wife Amy Singer and daughter Miranda.

# **Advice to Help Your Hearing**

If you are hard of hearing, there are many things you can do to overcome some of your hearing problems and gain more control over communicative situations. Below is a list of advice that might help you minimize your hearing problems when going to, for instance, a restaurant, a dinner party or place of worship.

- If it is difficult to hear the person who is talking to you then try to move closer. When you shorten the distance to the sound source, the sound will automatically be amplified and it will become easier for you to hear what the other person is saying.
- Seat yourself in the center of a group where it is easy to hear and see everybody. It is often best to avoid sitting at the very end of a table or a long sofa.
- If you are going to a restaurant or a private dinner party and loud background music is being played, then do not be shy to ask if the volume can be turned down.
- Noise levels can vary considerably even within the same room. Therefore, it will often be a good idea to
  place yourself away from noise-producing areas as, for example, the entrance, the kitchen in a restaurant,
  heating systems or loudspeakers.
- Planning in advance or arriving early will often prove helpful. If, for instance, you are going to the cinema or the theatre then call in advance and ask if they provide assistive listening devices or if they can recommend any seats for people with hearing problems.
- Arrive early if you are going to a lecture or seminar. In this way you have time to inform the speaker about
  your hearing problem and to stress that it is important that he or she uses the microphone properly and at
  all times.
- In connection with question and answer sessions, ask if the person who answers the questions can repeat the questions before answering.


