Dear Friends,

In June, the Mission Warehouse partnered with Southwest Medical Aid in Tucson to better meet those needs with medical equipment and supplies. This is a tremendous opportunity for us to realize the presence of the Holy Spirit and work hand in hand to fulfill a real need in the missions.

God bless all of you and the wonderful financial help you always provide to the Mission Warehouse. God's work through the Mission Warehouse would not exist without your constant support. On the second leg of our journey home from Tanzania last fall, I had the center seat on a plane out of Amsterdam. He asked why I had been in Tanzania, and after explaining Mission what the Warehouse is, his eyes lit up and he

I woke Dave from his nap, introduced the two, and within weeks Deji had visited the Warehouse and had everything in place for his own group from the Chicago area to receive and distribute goods in Nigeria. Seeing the joyfilled faces in the pictures that came back, I was awestruck by how the Holy Spirit worked to get Deji and I next to eachother on that airplane so His work could be accomplished.

In addition to sending containers of goods to our partners around the world, the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse also coordinates the purchase of rice for some missions.

- As mentioned, the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse is very pleased to be working directly with another Salvatorian ministry in Tucson, Az: SouthWest Medical Aid.
