

<u>July 16th Sewing Workshop from 11 to 3</u> will focus on making some items to sell at the 4H fair in August. Sign Up Here: <u>Courthouse Quilters: CHQ 4H Fair Sew (signupgenius.com)</u>. We will give a brief demo and instructions for all of the following:

Zipper pouches made from candy bags. Make two and keep one for yourself!

- Provided iron-on vinyl, zippers and an assortment of candy bags.
- <u>Bring</u> a fat quarter of fabric for lining and any specific bags you want to use.
- Tatiana has some great fruits and healthy snack bags that are gonna be great!

Aprons (both children's and adult sizes)

- <u>Provided</u> Limited fabric selection
- Bring 2 yards of coordinating fabric to make 2 adult aprons or 2 fat quarters to make 2 children's aprons.
- Please be sure to bring fun fabrics for kids and nice fabrics for the adult apron. Think animals, food, arts & crafts, Xmas, florals, sports. Current fabrics only please, otherwise they will never sell!

Pot Holders

- <u>Provided</u> limited kits are available
- <u>Bring</u> Cute fabrics (see above note) and insulbright if you want to make with your own fabric or if this is your jam and you want to make a bunch!

Framed Animal Fabric with stitching

 <u>Provided</u> - limited amount of animal fabric (that you can embellish by machine or hand) and mats to make them ready for framing. <u>Bring</u> - Threads and free motion foot for machine or hand needles and threads, etc. to embellish by hand. Again, if you want to do your own thing, bring whatever fabric you think would be cute.

<u>Bring</u> - your sewing machine and Accessories. Guild will provide cutting and ironing stations.

Of course, you can make any item of your choice and/or sew a charity quilt. If you don't feel like sewing, come and help cut and press. We will also have tubs of fabric that need measuring, pricing and sorting. I know it seems early, but we are already way behind...we need your help!

Come out and play with whatever floats your boat, it's sure to be a fun day!

"Clean the Clutter"



The CHQ Nominating Committee is seeking nominations for the position of Second Vice President. The position is a two year appointment whereby the individual functions in the role of Second Vice President in the first year and First Vice President in the second year. This is a great opportunity for a member who has interest in influencing the direction of CHQ workshops and programs! You may nominate yourself or any other guild member by providing names to one of the Nominating Committee members (see below). One of the committee members will reach out to the nominated individual(s) to further explain the role and gauge their level of interest.

The list of interested candidates will be circulated to CHQ members in October of this year and voting will take place during the November, 2023 meeting. Following is a description of the Second Vice President position.

Second Vice President

Assists the First Vice President with selection and organization of CHQ workshops/programs and monthly guild meetings/events. The Second Vice President will be in a training role for the first year, then will move into the First Vice President's role in the second year. The First Vice President (with assistance from the Second Vice President) is responsible for planning and executing creative, informative events, educational workshops/programs for the guild and leading/organizing the guild's speakers/events. Duties include identifying, contacting and scheduling teachers/speakers, preparing/signing contracts and payment, ensuring transportation/hotel considerations (if necessary) are met and setting up/coordinating workshops/programs. The Second Vice President performs the duties of the First Vice President in their absence (Currently, Anne Oswald is our First VP and Laura Kohl is Second VP; Laura will become First VP in 2024; this is an opportunity to work with Laura in 2024).



She'll discuss how she assembles quilts from the drawings, and share the best practices she follows for this process. The class will continue using the Exploring Curves Quilt as practice for sewing complex curves. This quilt is a wall hanging made from one large block that uses curved piecing to create the illusion of transparency from overlapping circles. She'll discuss building a palette and tips and tricks for stress-free curved piecing. Take the guesswork out of color selection by using one of the published color palettes inside the pattern! The Exploring Curves Quilt finishes at 24 x 24 inches. Drafting Complex Curves Booklet sold separately.
